

Easier Credit Conditions Aid Stock Recovery

NEW YORK, Apr. 22 (AP)—Easing credit conditions stimulated a general recovery in prices in today's stock market. Buying orders were distributed over a fairly broad list, gains of 1 to 7 points being quite common, with larger advances by a few high priced specialties. Trading showed a tendency to increase on the rally, indicating a broadening of public participation in the market.

Public utility stocks were in brisk demand on merger rumors and reports of new alignments in their eastern field. Adams Express soared 16 points. American Telephone ran up more than 6 points to a new high record at 236. American and Foreign Power, Federal Light and Traction, North American company and Western Union sold 2 to 5 points higher.

New high records for the year also were established by International Business Machines, Union Carbide, American Can, United Aircraft, W. F. B. 11, Aeromantic, Borg-Warner, Consolidated Film, and U. S. Industrial Alcohol.

Mexican Petroleum, which has not appeared on the tape for several weeks, selling dividend \$43, changed hands at 295, as against the previous sale of 246.

DEBT SHOWDOWN IS AGAIN DELAYED

Reparations Conference Meet and Adjourn Until 11 A. M. Tuesday

PARIS, Apr. 22 (AP)—The final showdown of the reparations conference was once more delayed this forenoon when the experts met in plenary session at the Hotel George V but almost immediately adjourned until 11 a. m. tomorrow.

Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, German reparations spokesman, came back to Paris today intent, it was believed, upon convincing creditor nation delegates to the reparations conference that Germany cannot pay their bill—or anywhere near it—until her earning capacity is increased.

The German spokesman, on leaving Berlin, where he conferred with the cabinet on the status of the Paris negotiations, told interviewers:

"I leave with the thought that in Paris I shall yet succeed in convincing even the doubting Thomases that our capacity to pay is not greater than I stated and that Germany's capacity can be increased only if her ability to produce is increased."

Among the allied nations experts, the feeling was entirely different. Not unless Dr. Schacht showed an inclination to better his offer of 1,650,000,000 marks (about \$396,000,000) as a first annuity by at least 150,000,000 marks, and provide for a rising annuity scale after that date, was it felt any compromise with him was possible.

Propaganda Is Aimed At Tariff Increases, Claim

WASHINGTON, Apr. 22 (AP)—A declaration that propaganda was being circulated in an attempt to make the public believe that proposed tariff increases must be borne by the consumer was made in a statement today by Representative Timberlake, republican, Colorado, a member of the ways and means committee now framing the new tariff revision bill.

He said an example of what he meant was the "attempt under way to defeat the higher duties asked by the American sugar beet and sugar cane farmer." Timberlake is an advocate of placing a limit of 500,000 tons on the annual importations of duty free sugar from the Philippine islands.
