Legionnaires To See Airport Dedication

SALEM, April 26—One of the big features of the state convention of the American Legion, which is to be held at Salem August 5-9-10 of this year, is to be the dedication of Salem's municipal airport which will be followed by a gigantic free barbecue.

The capital city recently voted a bond issue in the amount of \$50,000 to provide for a class A airport. The site for the field has been purchased and will be put in shape in time for the dedication in August.

A large number of planes will be on hand to add color to the dedication ceremonies and the event promises to attract thousands of visitors.

The affair is to be a large extent a celebration on the part of the Legion for the reason that that organization played a prominent part in putting over the bond issue.

The barbecue will be free to all and the food will be prepared in genuine barbecue fashion. Features too numerous to mention will be staged in connection with the dedication ceremonies. The event takes place on Thursday August 8, the opening day of the convention.

Bad Lands of South Dakota To Be Textbook Of Geology For Tourists

INTERIOR, S. D. (AP)—An open book on the evolution of animal life from the earliest geologic period soon will be readily accessible to automobile tourists.

The Bad Lands of South Dakota, 50,000 acres of geologic treasures and unique scenery, are to be made a part of the national park system as soon as the two requirements are met by citizens of the state.

The first is that a highway, already surveyed, be built through the area to provide easy access to the points of greatest interest. It will start at Interior, go over Big Foot pass, through the region known as the Pinnacles, and on west to Sage creek, a distance of about 30 miles.

The second requirement is that a few pieces of private property along the highway be acquired without cost to the federal government.

Senator Peter Norbeck, one of the leaders in the movement to preserve the Bad Lands, predicts that these conditions will be fulfilled within two years.

In its report on a survey of the territory, a congressional committee said:

"The topography of the South Dakota Bad Lands is so unique, varied and interesting, and the fame of the region as a large field for scientific exploration of the geologic past is so extensive, that the committee is of the opinion this area is worthy of national park status. . . . The fossil remains of prehistoric animals embedded in the formations of this region are found in great profusion."

"For over 80 years it has been the scene of operation for scientific expeditions from all parts of the world. Erosion has facilitated the exposure of these fossil remains and has caused the rugged contour of this section to assume the most fantastic and unique shapes. There is a wealth of scientific features with a wide range of exquisite coloring which cannot be found elsewhere."
