

Two Sections Of Berlin Held In State Of Siege

BERLIN, May 2 (AP)—Two sections of Berlin were declared in a state of siege today after a new outbreak of street fighting between midnight and dawn in which at least one person was killed, eight seriously injured and numerous further arrests were made.

Home for the May Day communist riot and the disorders which have taken place during the past few days has been laid at the door of Moscow communists and the Communist International by the Berlin chief of police and the same accusation has been made by Reichstag members.

In fact the German foreign office today started diplomatic proceedings with the government at Moscow in connection with the Bolshevik May Day demonstrations at which a number of members of the German cabinet were injured by posters. One poster was particularly violent, displaying the much-discussed new German battle cruiser with the inscription: "Eighty million marks for a coffee, but not a penny for feeding children and butlers for the unemployed."

Members of the cabinet who were ridiculed were Chancellor Mueller, minister of defense Goerke and minister of the interior Severing. In addition to police chief Goerke and others.

The total dead in the disorders which began May Day was at least ten today with the likelihood that twelve, or even more, may have been killed. Seven were killed during May Day disorders and two of those wounded on that day died in hospitals this afternoon.

Captain Pillsbury Is Dead At Salem

SALEM, Ore., May 2 (AP)—Captain A. B. Pillsbury, 52, who in Columbia river steamboat days commanded nearly all the river craft operated by the Oregon Steam Navigation company and its successor, the Oregon Railway & Navigation company, died here yesterday at the Methodist Old People's home.

Captain Pillsbury was born in Maine in 1844. His father was a sea captain out of Atlantic port. The son became a deep-water mariner at 16 and followed the sea for seven years. Twice his ship was wrecked. He came to Puget Sound by way of China and entered the Columbia river service in 1869.

He is survived by one son, Captain Dennis C. Pillsbury, United States infantry, stationed at Honolulu.

Funeral services will be held here today with interment in Portland.

By William Hurricane Hits Gulf Coast Of Mexico At Night

MEXICO CITY, May 2 (AP)—A hurricane swept the Gulf coast of Mexico last night, wrecking buildings and plantations and leaving a trail from Tampico south to Vera Cruz. One American, Victor Clark, member of the crew of the American steamer San Jacinto, at Tampico, was killed.

The wind exceeded a velocity of 50 miles an hour during most of the night at Vera Cruz. It was feared a number of small craft in the harbor there had come to grief. At Tampico the steamer San Jacinto was torn from its mooring in the harbor, river and collided with another ship, causing a number of the crew to be killed or injured and was drowned. Neither of two ships was believed seriously damaged.
