DIEGEL LEADING IN BRITISH OPEN

Turns in Sensational 70 Over Gullane Course in Scotland Today.

GULLANE, Scot., May 7 (AP)—Leo Diegel, brilliant but sometimes erratic golf champion, compiled a sensational 70 over the Gullane course today to leap into the lead in the qualifying rounds for the British open with a total of 144 strokes for 36 holes. The professional champion of the United States and holder of the Canadian open title had a snappy 74 in the rain at Muirfield yesterday. When he finished his round he took the lead by six strokes from Cyril Tolley, British amateur.

Boston Braves Drop Contest To Pittsburg, 4 - 3

By Herbert W. Barker (Associated Press Sports Writer). The National league pennant, it would appear, will go to the team possessed of the greatest stamina and of a fair share of the "breaks."

The league has had so many dog-fights in recent years that the customers have come to expect them. It looks like they will have little, if anything, to complain of this season.

Victories for three of the four eastern teams in their fights with the invaders from beyond the Alleghenies yesterday served to so tighten the race that Boston, in first place, now is removed from Philadelphia, in last, by only three and one-half games.

Boston's Braves, who have astonished not only the baseball world but themselves by holding on to the league lead, were the only eastern club to meet defeat. The Braves, despite a two-run rally in the ninth, dropped a 4-3 decision to the Pittsburg Pirates who vaulted into fourth place in the standings.

The Phils nosed out the Chicago Cubs, 2 to 1. Pinky Whites' single with the bases loaded in the ninth breaking up a pitching duel between Claude Willoughby and Sheriff Blake.

The New York Giants finally beat St. Louis but needed three home runs to pull out a 3 to 1 verdict. The Giants made eight other hits off Clarence Mitchell but circuit clouts by Terry, Jackson and Pullis were the only ones that counted in the scoring. Bill Walker, young southpaw, held the Cards to six hits, one of them Jimmy Wilson's homer in the ninth.

The reformed Brooklyn Robins clouted May and Kulp for 15 lusty hits and buried Cincinnati under a 12 to 3 score.

Reds Leading In Circuit As 7th Week Is Opened

By The Associated Press. Pacific coast league clubs shifted scenery today to begin a new leg in the race for the 1929 pennant.

The seventh week of the coast league pennant series finds the San Francisco Mission far ahead, with a lead they have maintained for four consecutive weeks. The consistent work of the Mission Reds has kept them ahead of their nearest rivals, the Los Angeles Angels, by several games. They now stand 24, won, and 11 lost. The Angels have to their credit 23 games won, with 18 lost.

This week the Seals will be at home to play the Seattle Indians; the Mission play in Sacramento;

the Hollywood Stars play at Oakland, and Portland plays the Angels in Los Angeles.

Competition in the league has been growing keener with each passing week, marked by better playing on all sides, particularly in the pitching sections. However, the series play thus far has proved that the Mission Reds have the best balanced team of the eight clubs, and with the same consistent effort for the rest of the season, should cop the banner.

The Hollywood Stars stand third in the rankings, with the San Francisco Seals fourth, the Oakland Oaks fifth, Sacramento's Senators sixth, Portland seventh, and the Seattle Indians last, a position they have occupied ever since almost the start of the season.

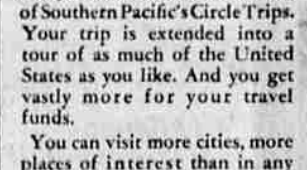
