EGG PRICES GO IN SLUMP TODAY

PORTLAND, Ore., May 7 (AP)—With buyers in a mood of doldrums, egg prices underwent a decided slump today. Standard extras and standard firsts declined one cent to 28 and 27, respectively. Medium extras experienced a similar slash to 25. Current receipts took a drop of 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 cents. Medium firsts remained at 26 cents. A peculiar twist of one big bid sent butter standards to 43 1/2%. The same price as extras. It was the opinion of buyers that this advantage would not hold through today's bidding. It was reported that 20,185 pounds, the largest for any day this season, went into storage Monday.
