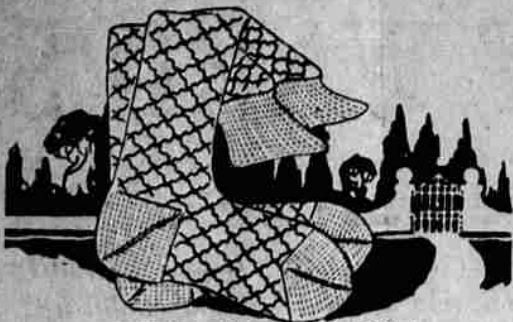

WHEAT DROPS TO NEW LOW LEVEL

Price is 30 Cents Below
Peak Quotations of the
Present Year.

CHICAGO, May 9 (AP)—Wheat values ebbed to new low levels on the Chicago wheat market today. Opening a bit firmer than yesterday's closing quotations, prices quickly dropped off as traders evinced discouragement with the failure to break the jam of an over-supplied market. Yesterday's buyers were on the selling side today, and at 11 a. m. wheat had sagged to 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 c below the previous close.

The unprecedented break that has sent wheat skidding thirty cents from the peak price of the year has failed to stimulate export demand. Foreign buyers have ignored American wheat in favor of Canada or the Argentine, where prices have met the competition of the huge carryover from the big 1928 United States crop and the trade was beginning to feel that the only incentive to demand for the old crop will be a heavy loss to growing North American or European crops. Emergency reduction of domestic freight rates to facilitate movement of the surplus to the seaboard apparently has gone unnoticed.

May wheat sold at \$1.04 1/2 at 11 a. m., compared with a closing price Wednesday of \$1.06 1/2. While wheat futures were slipping to record depth, flour quotations at Minneapolis dropped 20 cents a barrel today.

CHICAGO, May 9 (AP)—Starting at 1/2 to 3/4 advance, Chicago wheat later showed about 2 1/2 drop. Corn and oats also developed weakness, with corn opening unchanged to 1/2 @ 1/2 c up, and subsequently showing declines. Provisions were easy.

Wheat closed unsettled 2 1/2 to 4 1/2 net lower, corn 2 1/2 to 4 down, oats 1/2 to 1 1/2 off and provisions unchanged to a setback of 1/2 c.
