Accuse Woman Of Murdering Hubby

COLUMBIA, Cal., May 15 (AP)—In a setting that might well have been the scene of a Bret Harte tale, the court room a tree panelled dance floor in a canyon-jones rich with gold, mountain-jones here yesterday held Mrs. Eva Hablen to answer to a charge of poisoning to death her war veteran husband.
Hablen died at Tattletown the night of April 27 after he had been given a cup of coffee which authorities testified contained poison. Testimony of a drug clerk was introduced at the hearing to show that Mrs. Hablen had purchased the deadly drug.
Mrs. Hablen will be arraigned next Friday in superior court at Sonoma and a date will be set for her trial.
"I never killed 'Carroll Hablen,'" the widow sobbed when interviewed last night. "He was the only man I loved."
