PORTLAND, Ore., May 15 (AP)—Butter: lower on all grades except extras—Portland Dairy Exchange net wholesale prices.
Cubes: extras 45c; standards, 42c; prime firsts 42 1/2c; firsts 42c. Creamery prices: Prints 3c over cube standards.
Eggs: standard extras cent lower; Portland Dairy Exchange (net basis) fresh standards, extras 29c.

Egg And Butter Prices Decline In Mart Today

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15 (AP)—With sellers outnumbering buyers, both egg and butter prices declined today.
Butter standards dropped one cent to 42c, prime firsts half a cent to 42 1/2c, firsts one cent to 42c. Extras remained at 45c.
Butterfat delivered one cent all around being quoted 42 station, 44 truck and 46 to 47 delivered Portland.

Standard extra eggs clipped off one cent to 23c and current receipts half a cent to 23c.
Poultry and country meats were steady and unchanged.
In the vegetable line, tomatoes were getting scarcer. Asparagus is declining daily. New potatoes are down quarter of a cent.

Strawberries are coming in more plentifully, with a consequent easier price line. Hopper crops are reported in most sections. Sacramentos lettuce is 25 cents cheaper. Apples are thinning out with little cooking stock available. Florida grapefruit is still absent in quantity. When present supplies are exhausted it will perhaps be a premium.

Milk: butterfat cent lower all around. Itaw-milk (r per cent) 32 1/2c e. w. l. delivered Portland, less 1 per cent. Butterfat, station 42c; truck 44c; delivered at Portland 42 1/2c.
Poultry, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cascara bark, and hops steady unchanged.

Crop Conditions Send Wheat Down

CHICAGO, May 15 (AP)—Reports of auspicious crop conditions for domestic winter wheat, especially in Oklahoma, led to an early setback in wheat prices today. On the downturns, though, buying enlarged, considerable notice was taken of increasing advance pointing to damage fromessian fly in soft wheat states. Opening at 1/4 decline to 1/4c advance, wheat later showed downturns all round. Corn, oats and provisions were likewise easier, with corn starting 1/4 off to 1/4 advance, and subsequently undergoing a general sag.
Wheat closed weak, 1/4 to 1/2c net lower; corn a shade to 1/4c down; oats 1/4 to 1/2c advance, and provisions unchanged to five cents off.

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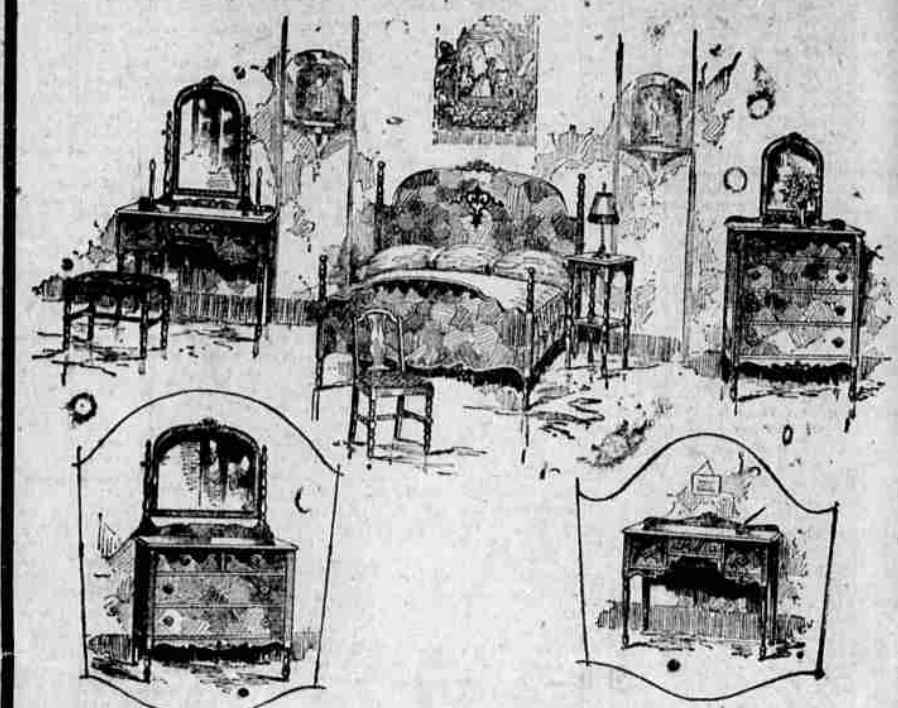
