### HEROIC PHONE GIRL PASSES ON

Remained at Post in Cleveland Hospital Despite Approaching Gas.

CLEVELAND, May 16 (AP)—AMONG the bravest heroines of the Cleveland clinic disaster was Gladys Gibson, a telephone operator at the clinic, who deliberately faced death while sending out alarms, and who died soon after in a hospital.

The brave telephone girl saw death approaching in the form of a gas of yellow poison gas, but she stayed at her exchange board making heroic efforts to warn everyone in the clinic of their danger, and to summon police, firemen and ambulances.

Faster than ever before in her life she worked, plugging in socket after socket in the switchboard, as she set all telephones in the clinic to ringing madly their alarm of death.

Finally the heroic girl collapsed. Someone carried her out, and soon she died in the hospital.

"Greater love hath no man," said a priest with tears in his eyes, as he saw Gladys die. "She was a brave and noble girl."

CLEVELAND, May 16 (AP)—The fire door leading from the x-ray room in the Cleveland clinic where the first explosion occurred yesterday had been left open, state fire warden investigating the tragedy announced today.

The warden's statement read: "The fire door leading to the room where the ceiling x-ray plates were stored and where the first explosion occurred, had been left open. If this door had been closed the disaster might have been averted."

Miss Frances Smith, of Pendleton, motored to Perry last Sunday and visited her parents for several hours, returning home the same day.

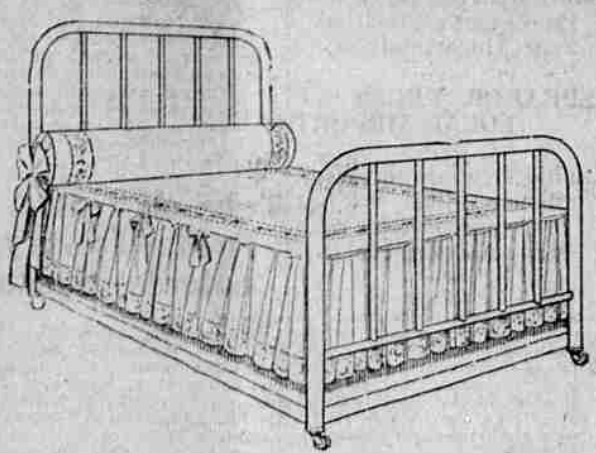

### THE GARDEN

#### ROCK GARDEN ANNUALS

Rock gardening has assumed a position of such importance that consideration of annuals to maintain color during the summer months is a question of garden efficiency. For the most part, the glory of the rock garden has departed by the end of June. The great masses of plants that require rock garden treatment for their best success are spring bloomers. By the judicious use of annuals of short and tufted growth color may be maintained during the entire season.

Care must be taken not to introduce too heavy growing annuals which might smother some of the rarer perennial subjects. Seed should be sown fairly late in the spring by merely scattering it on

bare patches among the rock plants.

First in importance of these tiny plants in popular esteem is the tiny rock cress, *jonopodium aculea*, a three-inch miniature with lovely blue flowers. It comes into bloom quickly and goes out quickly. A supply of seed to scatter every now and then will be useful. California has given us a number of bright little annuals for the rock garden and one of the prettiest and best known of these is baby blue eyes or nemophila.

The old-fashioned portulaca or rose moss makes a surprisingly effective plant scattered between the stones in a walk, particularly if laid in crazy paving style. It is also useful on the hottest and driest portions of the rock garden.

The violas raised from seed, especially those of the gracilis and cornuta types, will bloom late in the season from spring sown seed and may be used to produce fine color effects in the rock garden. Some of the dwarf phlox drummondii may be introduced to give a brilliant splash of color. *Sisymbirica gracilis* is another excellent plant.

*Sedum* are rock garden standbys and the little annual *sedum*, *S. concinnum*, with a wealth of blue bloom, is deserving of a choice place among the rock plants.
