Bullish Trend Develops Today In Wall Street

NEW YORK, May 16 (AP)—The stock market turned completely around today, breaking sharply at the opening when the call money renewal rate was fixed at 14 per cent and then rallying in spectacular fashion when the money rate dropped to 10 and loans were offered in the "outside" market as low as eight per cent. The wide fluctuations in money rates aroused widespread criticism among brokers and stock traders who were at a loss to understand why 14 per cent should be changed on loans at 10:30 a. m. and then have funds go heading less than two hours later at 10 per cent.

Bull operators raised some of the public utilities to new peaks in the last hour and with them went several specialties. Burroughs Adding Machine crossed 300 for the first time for a gain of 14 points. Sparta Withington gained nearly 11 points, also a new high.

Detroit Edison duplicated its old high of 260 and there were material advances in North American, Borg-Warner and Hawaiian steamship. The closing was strong. Sales approximated 3,700,000 shares.



CHICAGO, May 16 (AP)—Opening 5c to 3/4c off, wheat after-ward kept near the initial range. Corn prices also were easy, starting 1/4c @ 1/2c off to 3/4c @ 1/2c up, and subsequently showing but little change. Oats tended upward. Provisions held steady.

Wheat closed weak, 1/4 to 1/2 net lower, corn at 1/2 decline, to 1/4 advance; oats 1/4 off to a shade up, and provisions unchanged to a setback of 5c.
