Drunken Driver Ordered to Jail

ENTERPRISE, Ore., May 15—After deliberating about 15 minutes, the jury before which Oliver Velleaux was tried on the charge of driving a motor car while intoxicated, brought in a verdict of guilty Tuesday afternoon. This was the first case of the kind in the county to result in a conviction.

Velleaux was sentenced Wednesday to serve 60 days in the county jail and a fine of \$250 was also imposed. In passing sentence Judge Knowles said he believed the law under which the defendant was convicted was one of the best laws ever passed for the protection of the public.
