**Highway Board
 Balks At Cost
 Of Right of Way**

PORTLAND, May 24 (AP)—The Seal Rock section of the Oregon coast highway in Lincoln county may or may not be constructed. This was as much as the state highway commission could say today in commenting upon a discussion late yesterday at the regular meeting of the commission.

A right of way is necessary. The commission says, however, that it is faced with the spectacle of soaring land values on property of little worth and that it cannot afford to purchase this property at the price asked by the owners.

Property at Seal Rock, south of Quina Bay, the commission said, was taken over by Lincoln county some time ago and sold for delinquent taxes at as low as \$1.35 a beach lot. This property is now valued by its owners at what the highway commissions says is an inordinately high figure. Prospects of a highway in the district has wrought this change, engineers declared.

The commission said the money appropriated for this work would be applied on some other project if the right of way could not be acquired for a reasonable figure.

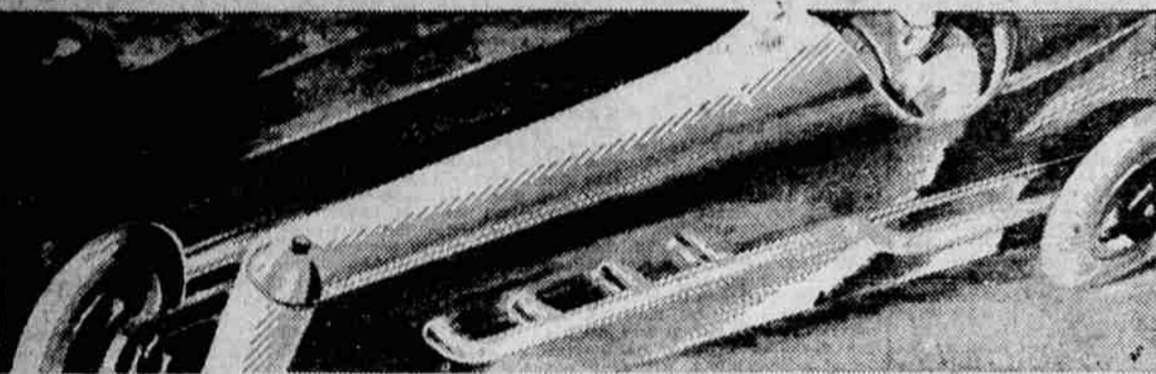
Cop Fails to Stop; Accident Is Fatal

Ice formed on the goggles and he had to remove them at the top of his climb, when the temperature was 76 below zero.
