Reaction Hits Wall Street In The Afternoon

NEW YORK, May 24 (AP)—The stock market turned extremely reactionary today after an early period of strength. A heavy wave of selling in the last hour cut down or wiped out nearly all of the early gains and sent a long list of issues down 1 to 4 points below yesterday's final quotations. The selling was attributed to speculative uncertainty over the federal reserve movement situation and Senator King's proposal for a congressional investigation of credit.
