

JULY WHEAT IS BELOW A DOLLAR

Grains Outdo all Previous Low Record Prices in Chicago Today.

CHICAGO, May 28 (AP)—With offerings free and only moderate buying, wheat, corn, and oats all outdid previous low record prices today in the early dealings, July wheat, in which the trading was most active, dropped to below \$1.00 a bushel, rivaling yesterday's performance of the May delivery. Partly due to rains in Canada and blizzard conditions in Liverpool wheat quotations than had been anticipated were depressing factors. Opening unchanged to 1/8c off, Chicago wheat later underwent a further setback. Corn started 1/2c to 3/4c lower, rallied, and then fell again. Oats were irregular. Provisions tended downward.

Wheat closed nervous 1/4 to 1/2c net lower; corn unchanged to 1/4c off; oats 1/2 to 1 3/4c down; rice showing 2 1/2 to 3 1/2c drop, and provisions unchanged to a setback of 20 cents.

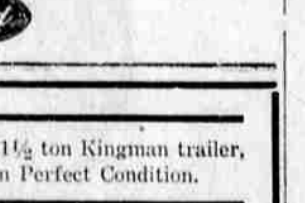
