

HOME PRODUCTS SHOW OPENS FRIDAY

30 DISPLAYS ARRANGED ON FLOOR SPACE

Show Opens Tomorrow Evening at 6 o'clock, to Continue Saturday.

\$1,000 IN PRIZES TO BE GIVEN AWAY

Entertainment Program Arranged for Event—No Admission Charges Will Be Made.

A display of home products, which is proving a surprise even to persons more or less thoroughly acquainted with the county's products, is being gathered together today in preparation for the opening of the Home Products show in the Sackajawa Inn ballroom tomorrow at 6 p. m.

Besides the excellent and valuable display of products, an entertainment program has been prepared which insures those who attend the exposition of an enjoyable as well as educational visit to the large ballroom.

The Home Products show, which had its inception in the Union county chamber of commerce a few weeks ago, is to become an annual affair, and already plans are being discussed with the hope of making the following year's display even more effective.

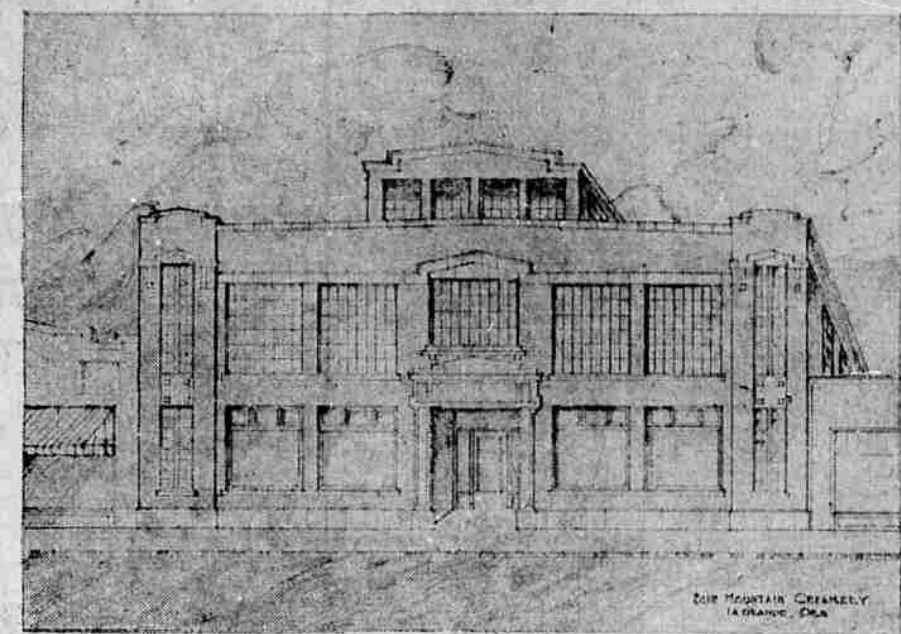
Movement Successful The movement in general has met with almost instant success. At first it was feared that interest would tend to decrease unless the show was given shortly after the campaign started, but on the contrary, the interest has steadily increased.

As part of the program—and there is no charge for admission; in fact, everything is free—more than 50 prizes will be given away during the two days.

After the show is opened at 6 p. m. tomorrow, the first 10 or more prizes will be given away at 8:30 o'clock and a second group will be given away at 10. On Saturday, prizes will be given at the same time, also at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

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CREAMERY TO ERECT TWO-STORY BUILDING HERE THIS AUTUMN

Blue Mountain Butter, Ice Cream, Etc., Build Business to New Level

"Blue Mountain Butter," "Blue Mountain Ice Cream," "Blue Mountain pasteurized milk, Bulgarian buttermilk, manufactured ice, are some of the "home products" furnished residents of this county by the Blue Mountain Creamery, R. E. Tyler, proprietor.

Checks to cream patrons throughout the country make the big contribution to the money set in circulation by this plant, since the average price paid for butter-fat last year was 48.55, delivered at the creamery and 47.85 when picked up by the trucks.

The wares put on the local market from the Blue Mountain Creamery including both wholesale and retail trade, include ice cream, pasteurized milk and cream, butter, ice, eggs and Bulgarian buttermilk.

The business which has been built up through the years has now outgrown the present plant located on Washington avenue. This fall, Mr. Tyler contemplates the erection of a new creamery, on the same location, which will have improvements, and will adequately care for his business.

The building will be of reinforced concrete construction—basement and two stories, faced brick front, and will stand 72x99 feet, giving in all 19,440 square feet of floor space.

At the rear of the east side of the building is the sterilizing room, 12x34 where bottles and cans will be received, washed and sterilized.

20 People Are Employed Here By Laundry Co.

The Modern Laundry of La Grande, with equipment valued at around \$30,000, gives employment to a force of 20 people who in turn put in circulation locally from salaries and wages from \$1200 to \$1500 each month of the year.

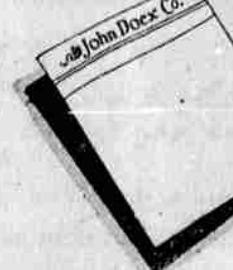
