### ATHLETICS WIN IN 13 INNINGS

#### St. Louis Browns Remain in Second Place, Much to Disgust of Experts.

While five clubs snipe away at the National League lead, Cornell McGillicuddy's Philadelphia Athletics have taken over the duty—usually reserved for the Yankees—of making a runaway out of the American league race.

#### 13 Inning Win

The A's had to travel 13 innings to down Detroit and hung up their sixth straight win and 17th in their last 18 games yesterday and this shattered George Uhl's nine-game winning streak while they were about it.

The Browns kept step with a 5 to 4 triumph at Washington's expense, getting to Garland Beaton for four runs in the first inning. Sunday Gray kept the Senator's bats well scattered.

#### The "Ruth-less"

New York Yankees made it three in a row over the Chicago White Sox, winning 1-9 behind Ed Wells' hot-hit pitching. The Yankees scored five single tally in the first inning on Cambs' single and the first of three doubles by Gene Robertson.

The ding-dong fight continued in the National league with the St. Louis Cardinals maintaining their game and a half lead over the field.

#### The Cards nosed out Brooklyn

#### The Pirates maintained their hold on second place by trouncing the Phillies, 14 to 2, as Bartoigh Grimes hung up his ninth straight victory of the season, without a defeat, the best record in either major league. Paul Waner hit a home run and two doubles and scored four runs.

#### Giants Win Third Game

Carl Hubbell pitched steady ball and the New York Giants outscored Chicago's Cubs for the third straight time, 2 to 1. Hubbell had the Cubs blanked until the ninth when three singles sent one run across the plate. The victory enabled the Giants to pass the Phillies and go into fourth place.

COVE, Ore., (Special)—The Livestock club boys and girls are very busy just now getting their pet animals ready for the show at Union this week. These animals have to be washed, rubbed, combed and blanketed, their hair trimmed in just a special way and some of it curled. In addition to this the weighing and measuring of feed must be done. The assistant state club leader and the acting county agent have been making trips all over the valley giving instructions on how to get the animals ready for show. Among other directions they were told that calves tails must be clipped and to one boy clipping means only one thing to be sent home and clipped the brush off the tail of his calf. The calf is a good one and may win a premium even if it does look a little bobbed. Of the Jersey clubs including both purchased and grade the Mills family will send 10, the Belts 13 and Duncans nine. The Holstein clubs will send both purchased and grade of which Conspicuous will send 9, Beckers 4, Barnes 3, Bakors 2 and Kogers 1. In the open class, Charles D'Hans will send 2, Dr. Little one and J. E. Mills will send one cow, Molly, 8 years old that was one of the first two calves to start club work in Cove. It is a purchased Jersey and was owned by Gordon Mills and the other calf was owned by Martin Daniel. From this small beginning has grown the club work of today.
