WORLD DEMAND GROWS FOR LABOR PAMPHLETS
GENEVA (AP)—The International labor office publications on technical subjects are increasing steadily under pressure of a world wide demand.

In 1925 the sum obtained from the sale of such publications amounted to slightly more than \$20,000. Sales during the past year reached a value of almost \$50,000.

International publications are sold now in 41 countries. Increases in sales have been notable in Germany, Great Britain and Spain. The next countries on the list are France and Italy. Approximately \$2,000 worth of the publications were sold in the United States during 1928.
