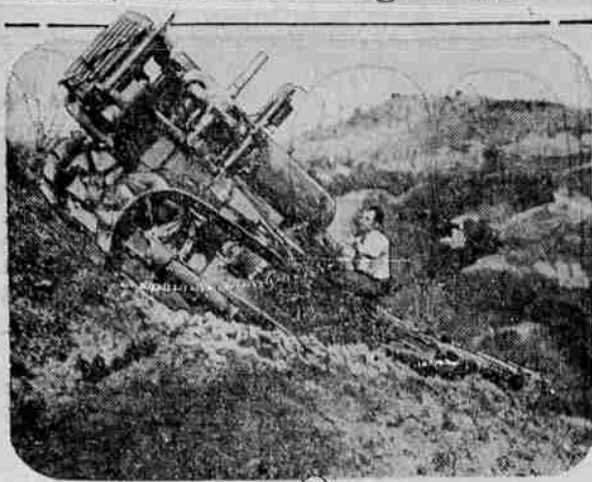

The opinion was in reply to an inquiry by the state industrial accident commission, and pertains to janitors in the Portland public schools who have entered into contracts with the school board.

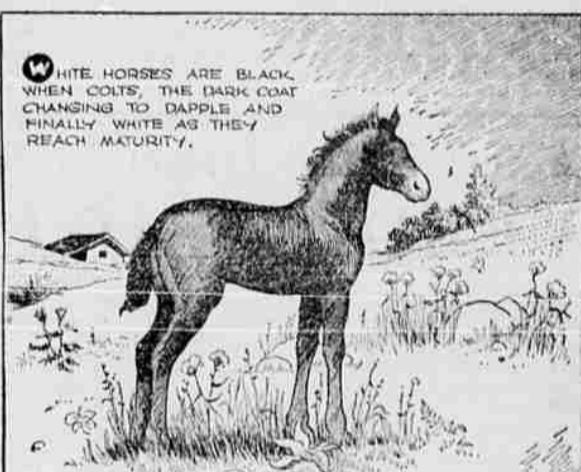

Balanced Diet Is Recommended To Keep Health

During the spring and summer months people are very apt to give less attention to their personal well being, particularly in a trip to the dentist or physician is a task. The natural result of this inertia, which is rather common to all of us, is the tired feeling and the seeming need for a rest. Many people complain of bleeding gums and the unwholesome feeling of the mouth which, however, can be traced back to an improper diet and improper care of the teeth and gums. Many of the so-called spring and summer disorders can be overcome by a properly balanced diet. Green vegetables, oranges when possible, wholesome milk and very little meat should be the basis for the summer diet. This food combination can be rather pleasantly had in salads of all descriptions, cooked vegetables and food fruit desserts. It is a well known fact that the character of the teeth and gums can be changed by an unwholesome diet. Dr. Percy Howe of Boston has produced pyorrhea in monkeys by eliminating certain vitamins from their diet. He has also restored their mouths to normal by the addition of this vitamin. It is well to have the teeth and gums thoroughly examined in the spring, and again in the summer. Your dentist may advise you to use salt water or pure baking soda as a dentifrice. Vigorous brushing according to proper instructions will keep the mouth in the best of condition. The mouth is the gateway for many forms of infections; therefore it would seem logical to keep this important part of
