

BOND ISSUE FOR STATE COMPARED

Oregon Builds Finest Highway System of Any State, McDaniel Says.

"Oregon's bond issue for highway purposes has built the finest highway system of any state, taking into consideration population and car registration," stated Dr. E. B. McDaniel, president of the Oregon State Motor association in a recent address.

"In 1917 the voters of Oregon authorized the issuance of bonds for highway purposes up to 4% of the assessed valuation of the state," continued the doctor "and of this amount approximately 25 million dollars have been issued but bonds have been gradually retired until at present we owe approximately 25 million dollars.

"The amount of bonds authorized by the various states in the Union and the year of their authorization provides a very interesting study as it shows the approximate time when each state became road conscious."

Ford Plant Is To Be Erected On Bosphorus

On the Bosphorus in the city of Constantinople, not far distant from the crumbling ruins of Troy and the historic Hellespont, Ford cars and trucks will be assembled before the end of the year 1929. Men from the Dearborn offices of the company are now in Constantinople (Stambul) cooperating with representatives of the Ford Motor company, experts, Inc., in preparations for the new plant.

Seventy-five cars a day will be its capacity, it is planned. The location is close to the center of the city and alongside the famous waterway, being separated from the latter only by the quays. The site is leased from the Serai-Sofin, a prominent steamship concern, and is to be remodelled and reconstructed to meet Ford requirements.

The equipment will include everything necessary for the assembly of Ford products—conveyer lines, enamel ovens, and chassis line; the arrangements for the workmen will be modern in every respect. All of the property will be enclosed and a customs godown will be one of the buildings embraced therein. Three electric cranes which served the property

before it was obtained by Ford are being retained and will be used by the plant.

Upon its completion, arrangements will be made to discontinue the service plant in Alexandria, Egypt, which up to the present time has been serving Ford dealers in the near east. Constantinople is considered more advantageous from a distributing standpoint, it offers ready access not only to the Mediterranean, but also to the Black sea ports of Russia, Rumania and Bulgaria. Likewise Constantinople offers excellent contacts with Asiatic Turkey and nearby countries.

Before undertaking the new plant, Ford representatives conferred with Turkish officials at Ankara and have received excellent cooperation in all respects from that government.

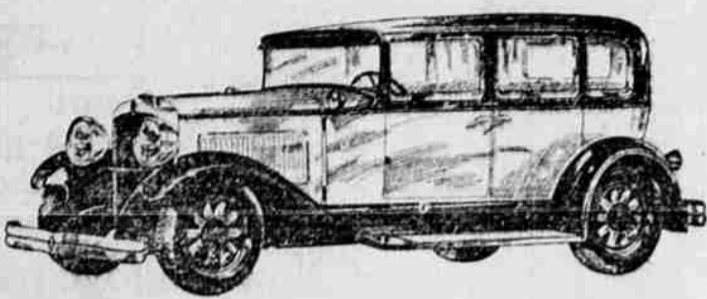

New Laws Affecting Automobiles Are Now In Effect Over the State

SALZM, Ore. (Special)—New laws affecting the operation of motor vehicles upon the public highways of the state of Oregon, became effective at midnight, June 4, and are now of interest to all motorists. Though the provisions for a reduction of license fees and an increase in the gasoline tax do not become effective until January 1, 1929, there are a number of enactments respecting motor vehicles which the 51st day after the adjournment of the legislature, ushered into being. How the rights and duties of the motoring public will be immediately affected by the numerous acts of the recent legislature is shown by a summary prepared by Hal E. Hoss, secretary of state.

Motor vehicles registered at any time during the period from June 4 to June 30, inclusive, will be licensed for 25 per cent off the annual fee prescribed by the present law. This is provided for by an amendment contained in Chapter 294 which declares that "after the expiration of the first quarter of the registration year, a three-fourths annual license fee shall be paid." In subsequent years, this reduction will inure to vehicles registered on and after April 1, but in the present year it can only be applied to registrations made after the amendment becomes effective. The provisions for a 50 per cent reduction after the expiration of the first half of the registration year and a 75 per cent reduction after three-fourths of the year has expired are also embodied in the new law.

The owner or operator of a transient automobile registered in another state may no longer escape responsibility for accidents caused by him, by avoiding the service of papers in a suit in the courts in this state, as Chapter 259 provides that "the acceptance by a nonresident of the rights and privileges conferred by the laws of the state of Oregon to use the roads, highways and streets of this state, as evidenced by his operating a motor vehicle

thereon, shall be deemed equivalent to an appointment by such nonresident of the secretary of state of the state of Oregon as his successor in office to be his true and lawful attorney, upon whom may be served all lawful summons and process against him growing out of any accident, or liability incurred in which said non-resident may be involved while operating a motor vehicle upon such highway."

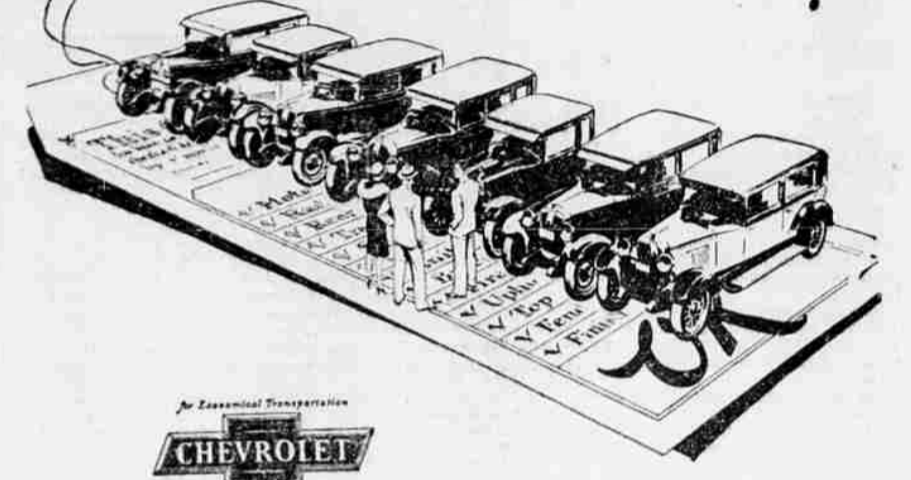
A motor vehicle owner or operator who transports another person as his guest without charge will be subject to a cause of action for damages by such guest if in an accident which is intentional or part of such owner or operator, or which is the result of his gross negligence or intoxication or his reckless disregard of the rights of others, the guest sustains injury, death or loss. This Chapter 491 modifies the sweeping statutory rule sought to be established by the 1927 legislature, but found unconstitutional by the supreme court and repealed in 1925, declaring that the acceptance of a free ride in a motor vehicle should be presumed to be a waiver by the guest of any liability for accidental injury caused by the owner or operator of the vehicle.

Appointment by the secretary of state of an adequate number of state traffic officers to effectively patrol and police the highways is provided by Chapter 295. At present the number is restricted to 70 but the new law removes this limitation, and further, provides for the employment of a chief deputy traffic officer.

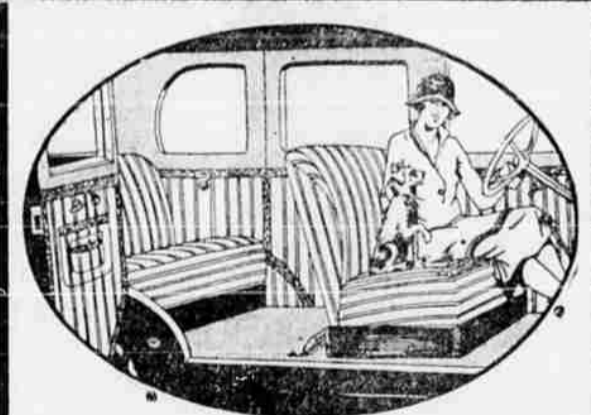
