FOUR ACCEPT NOMINATIONS AS DIRECTORS

Dr. J. L. Ingle, W. C. Perkins, J. Y. Walnum and G. E. Walker in Race.

SCHOOL ELECTION IS NEXT MONDAY

Petition Nominating Mr. Perkins Filled Saturday—Decides Today to Run For Office.

With four nominations filed and the four nominees all agreeing to accept the nominations, present indications point to a heavy vote next Monday, June 17, when two directors will be elected to the La Grande board of education.

The four men who have been nominated are: Dr. J. L. Ingle, candidate to succeed himself; James Y. Walnum, passenger engineer; G. E. Walker, head car inspector for the railroad, and W. C. Perkins, of the Perkins Motor company.

All of the petitions to nominate were filed with School Clerk H. E. Williams Saturday, but Mr. Perkins did not reach a decision to accept the nomination until today.

Filed Without His Knowledge The name of Mr. Perkins was filed Saturday without his knowledge when he was in Portland. He had been approached previously by numerous friends and urged to run but had turned them down, but his name was filed in spite of this and Mr. Perkins said today that he had decided to run only because he did not feel that he could turn his friends down after they had gone this far. Mr. Perkins emphasized the fact, however, that he did not wish any campaign made and expressed the hope that the people of the district would decide who the new directors would be elected to their seats and capacity for center to the schools of the city.
