Thoroughly Investigate Systemic Condition If Subject to Recurrent Styes and Boils.

A stye is an abscess, or in reality a boil, in the eye lid near the margin. It is due to infection in one or more of the glands found there. There are two varieties—the external and the internal.

At first only a slight redness and swelling of the lid occurs. This gradually increases until the eye may be nearly or entirely closed. On carefully pressing along the lid margin with the finger tip, a tender somewhat firm spot is discovered that gradually increases as the condition develops. Later a small tender swelling may occur just in front of the ear on the same side. The eye usually tears considerably, and is quite bloodshot. Within two or three days a yellowish point appears at the spot where the lid is most tender. If left to run its course, the abscess ruptures spontaneously and rather thick yellow pus exudes, frequently leaving a thick core in the opening.

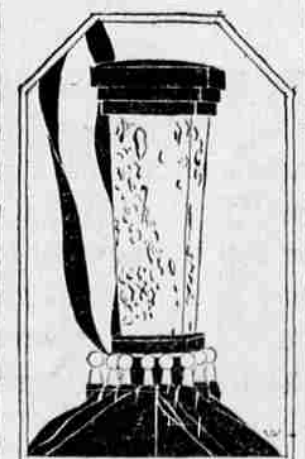
Occasionally a stye may recur, or the condition may move through the opening. Before rupture occurs the lid is very lame and painful, but as soon as the pus is expelled great relief is felt. Very often a crop of styes is experienced. If proper treatment and precautions are not instituted at the outset, they are usually found in young people, especially in anemic individuals. Inflamed lid edges and crusting in the lashes favor their development.

In adults, if there is a tendency to boils and styes, the urine must be tested for sugar. Eye strain may be a factor causing their occurrence. A thorough check-up of the patient's general physical condition, including a blood and urine test, together with proper therapeutic measures, should be made early by a reputable physician. Also a careful examination of the eyes by a competent physician is strongly advised. Aside from the pain, discomfort and inconvenience caused by styes, certain more or less permanent damage to the structures of the lid may result.
