

# Local News In Brief

**Two-Day Fishing Trip**—C. N. Palmer and Sherwood Williams were Wallawa county visitors Saturday and Sunday in search of clear waters and good fishing. The sheet creeks and Innahs they report high, the former especially muddy, although the Innahs yielded a nice catch.
