### Melons Higher With Fourth Of July Nearing

PORTLAND, June 24 (AP)—Warmth and the approach of July Fourth are having their seasonal effect on watermelons, cantaloupes and lemons. The three products today experienced a sharp advance over Saturday's quotations. Lemons were hit hardest by a rise of 59 cents. Melons and cantaloupes went up over a range from 1-4 to 2-4 cents. No recession was expected before the July Fourth demand has passed its peak.

The best strawberries are trailing along at \$1.75 and scarce at that. The crop in this immediate area is burning up.

Outlook for the raspberry season is declared unusually promising. A big harvest was predicted unless weather prevents the orderly ripening process. A few of the berries were beginning to arrive. Butter and egg values remained unchanged over the weekend. The week closed with both in good demand.

### Sharp Upturn In Wheat In Chicago

CHICAGO, June 24 (AP)—Flooded fields in the harvest region Southwest and dearth of moisture in drought districts Northwest led to a sharp new upturn on wheat values today. A general rush to buy wheat was witnessed, and the consequent rise of values was shared by corn. Starting with 3/4 to 2c gain, wheat reacted a little but afterward averaged higher than before. Corn opened 3/4 to 3/8 up and kept near to initial figures. Oats were easy, provisions held steady.

Wheat closed nervous 3/4 to 1 1/4 higher, corn unchanged to 1/2 down, oats 3/8 to 1/2 up and provisions varying from 1/2 decline to a rise of 10 cents.
