Mr. and Mrs. S. A. Robinson spent Sunday in La Grande at the home of their daughter, Mrs. Ethel Gaertner.

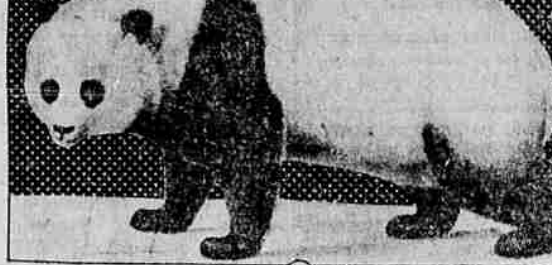
