JONES SWAMPS ESPINOSA SUNDAY

Amateur wins Third Open Golf Championship by Margin of 23 Strokes.

By Brian Bell (Associated Press Sports Writer) MAMARONCK, N. Y., July 1 (AP)—Robert T. Jones Jr. started back home to his Atlanta law office today with the open golf championship cup Bobby Jones won in a play-off for the title.

The southern city today is the golf capital of the United States, for Bobby's third victory in the open comes when the amateur championship cup is paying a visit of a year to the clubhouse of the East Lake club, country home of the Atlanta Athletic club, for the fourth time.

In winning his third championship, the great Jones played golf only as he can play it. "I saw it, but I still don't believe it," said a golfer of fair ability after the king of the amateurs had defeated Al Espinosa, a clever professional, by 23 strokes in a 36-hole play-off over the trap-infested course of the Winged Foot golf club.

One-Sided Score Never has a championship been decided by such a one-sided score. Jones' margin of victory was 23 strokes, a 26-hole total of 141 to 164 for Espinosa. The courageous Chicago professional, outclassed by Jones' better than perfect golf, went down but he never quit. He began to slip early in the day and grew steadily worse but he never lost his smile and there was no suggestion of anything but sincere admiration for a great golfer as he swung Bobby's hand in congratulation at the 36th green.

At never did get going and could not "break" easily. He had a bad round of 84 in the morning, taking 45 "blows," as the pros call strokes, on the second nine. In the afternoon his best was an even 89. The amateur champion, after a wobbly start, going three strokes over par on the first three holes, hit the Jones stride and it was all over but the extent of his victory. Chicago Cubs Running Riot In National League--Win 4 Straight

Chipman (Associated Press Sports Writer) With earnest Yankee bounds vainly pursuing athletic mechanical rabbits in the American league dug derby, baseball attention has turned southeast to John Heydler's circus, where the Cubs are running riot. The National league leaders cleaned up four decisions at Sportsman's park, the last in a remarkable uphill fight yesterday.

With the Cardinals leading by 8 to 1 at the end of the third, the Cubs began to fight. They worked away at Elysester Johnson for a total of four runs in the next two rounds, and dropped him through the ropes with a five-run assault in the sixth.

Brains Maintain Margin From that point onward, nothing even checked the Cubs, who totaled nineteen hits to win by 14 to 8. Although the Pirates just lasted to shade the Reds by 7 to 6 at Cincinnati, the Bruins maintained their margin of half a game, with the pleasant prospect of entertaining the Redlegs over the holiday while the Buccaneers are contending with the Cards.

The fourth Chicago victory in St. Louis ran Joe McCarthy's aching over the Cardinals to eight straight. The Cubs dropped the opener of a five game brush at Wexley field a week ago, but took the next four without a halt. The Bruins' record against the league champions to date is eleven victories and four defeats, assuring them as good a showing as they made against the St. Louisians last year when the twenty-two games were divided.

Even the Phillies now are im-

pending the progress of the Giants through the supposedly soft part of John McGraw's schedule in the east. Entering the polo grounds with a record of only one victory over the Giants in eleven starts, the Philadelphia Phils forced the home boys to work hard for the odd game in five.

The Philadelphiaans divided two doubleheaders with the New Yorkers over the weekend, winning the second game yesterday by 1 to 2 after the home team had taken the opener by 14 to 2.

Double Double Bill The Braves and the Robins divided a double bill at Ebbets field. The home team took the first leg, Babe Ruth 5 to 3, largely because of Del Bissonette's third homer in two days, and the Bostoners grabbed the second by 10 to 8, in eight rounds. It was called an account of alleged darkness, but nobody cared.

The American league campaign yesterday presented the odd spectacle of the Yankees engaged in gaining a game on the Athletics. The Mackmen had to lose one to Washington some time, and Sunday was the day. The Senators' 12 to 2 triumph broke Mr. Mack's run of eleven straight against the capital city team.

As the Mackmen came to grief, the Yankees were winning from the Boston Red Sox 6 to 4 at Braves field. Babe Ruth got his sixteenth homer.

He deprived the Browns of a chance to win by another game in Chicago, and Detroit shaded Cleveland by 11 to 10 at Navin field.

The 35 for the homecoming journey was "one more" remarkable in that it included a six at the 15th hole, where his tee shot came to rest under a bush, and he had to take it out with a penalty of two strokes.

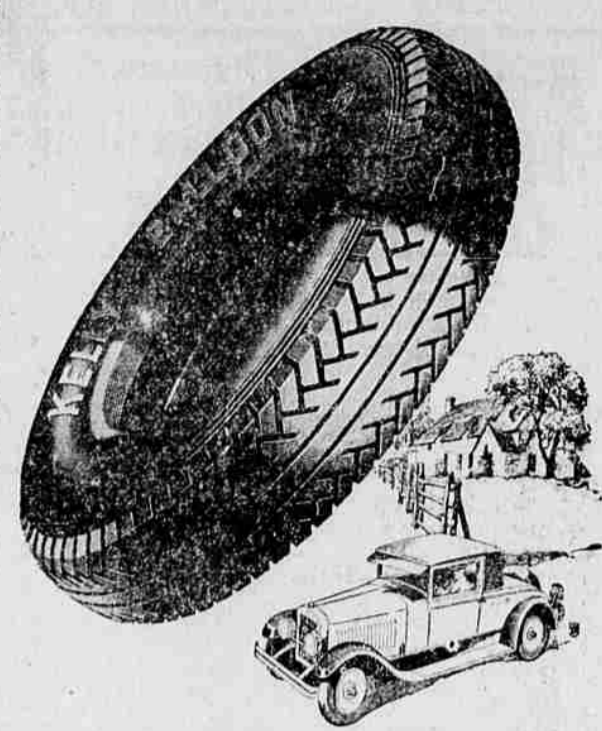
Beats Old Man Par The real Jones brand of golf was displayed in the afternoon, when he held par even for the first nine holes and then drove the exacting old man to zero in a complete rout with 11 on the second nine, all three and four--three threes and six fours. If Al had not removed himself from active competition in the morning when he was 12 strokes in arrears, he would have been "fired to death" in the afternoon.

Jones' 69 in the afternoon enabled him to pick up 11 additional strokes from Espinosa, and the grand total was 23. No wonder the golfer who saw it did not believe it.

Jones now has won nine national championships in the United States and Great Britain. Besides the three American open triumphs, he has won the U. S. amateur crown four times and the British open twice, all within seven years.
