**WRECK WIPES OUT FAMILY**

ANGOLA, Ind., July 1 (AP)—Noah P. Trooper, of Detroit, was without a family today as a result of a motor collision near Lake George yesterday in which his wife, their three children and his father were killed.

The car driven by Trooper was in a head-on collision with that driven by Herman Scott, 22, of Coldwater, Mich. The Trooper car immediately burst into flames. Scott crawled from his machine in time to extricate Trooper from his burning car, but the other members of the party were trapped.

Mrs. Otha Trooper, 27, wife of Trooper; their two daughters, Iona, 7, and Eleanor, 5; their three-year-old son, Robert; and Trooper's father, Henry Trooper, 53, of Plainville, Ind., were burned to death. The surviving man was taken to a hospital here with head and shoulder injuries and burns but his condition was not considered serious.

**16 DROWNED**

Drownings claimed 16 lives over the weekend in various sections of the United States and Canada.

American river in California claimed four lives Sunday by drowning. John Eleopoulos, 15, and Ely Paracel, 15, Roseville youths, succumbed at Fair Oaks; LaFayette McGrath, 60, Sacramento

county employe, and his wife, aged 50, drowned near Folsom. Joe Poppio, sewer digger, drowned in Pipe lake, near Seattle, when a canoe overturned.

Mrs. Hazel Eva Mitchell, 22, and Budd Fison, 22, both residents of Centralia, Wash., were drowned at Summit lake, near Olympia. Plunging headlong into a ten-gallon milk crock, Olga Shuben, two-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Shuben, was drowned at Palo Cedro, Cal.

At Midland, Ontario, three men were drowned when eight persons fell from a boat into Georgian bay. Five men were drowned at Riviere du Loup, Quebec, when a bridge on which they were standing collapsed and threw them into the St. Lawrence river.

**CHILDREN VICTIMS**

NORTH BEND, Ore., July 1 (AP)—Jack Wilson, Marshfield, motorist, was improving in a hospital here today following an automobile accident Saturday night in which two children, Jacina, 12, and Betty Hansen, 20 months, were killed. The accident occurred when the automobile driven by J. L. Hansen, Marshfield contractor, accompanied by his wife, six children and another man, locked wheels with Wilson's machine.

Hansen suffered three broken ribs. Mrs. Hansen was cut and bruised and Wilson suffered other injuries.

**11 DIE IN WASHINGTON**

**Brooklyn Bull Fighter Hero In Seville, Spain**

SEVILLE, Spain, July 1 (AP)—Sporting Spain today acclaimed Sydney Franklin, Brooklyn bull fighter. He suffered injuries here at the horns of his bull yesterday, was sent to a hospital, but returned in time finally to dispatch the animal.

Franklin, wearing a tobacco brown jacket with gold trimmings, had his cape caught in the horns of his second bull of the day. The bull, a huge black beast, twisted his head and downed the American, who was bruised and badly mauled before his fellows in the ring could get him away.

He was taken immediately to a clinic where his wounds were dressed. Meanwhile back at the arena the "espada," or second man in the ring, made ready to substitute for Franklin in killing the bull. He had just entered the ring when Franklin himself appeared, and despite many bandages, insisted on completing the job himself.

He obtained a new sword and made short shrift of the animal, the audience giving him an ovation when he was down, and partly by his good luck in escaping a goring when he was down, and partly by his courage in coming back and vindicating his skill in the arena.

The bull was Franklin's second of the afternoon; the first, a bay animal, having outplayed him slightly. Franklin's first "muleta" failed to hurt the animal and a second was required. This extra

trial dimmed the enthusiasm of the huge audience, many of whom had come a great distance either afoot or in ox carts to witness the performance of the "Yankee torero."

The huge arena was filled with women wildly waving their shawls in their enthusiasm, and as many of the younger and more beautiful señoritas wearing the classic mantilla.

**Lindbergh Soars In Glider Sunday**

ST. LOUIS, Mo., July 1 (AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh had his first flight in a glider here yesterday when he soared in one at Lambert-St. Louis field with more than 16,000 persons as spectators.

Lindbergh, paying his first visit to his legal home since his marriage to Miss Anne Morrow, spent most of Sunday at the airport and when offered the opportunity by Harry Kuchins, owner of the glider, readily accepted. The automobile of Major William B. Robertson, one of Lindbergh's backers in the New York to Paris flight two years ago, furnished the starting power as the field is level. He said he was well pleased with the glider flight.

KANSAS CITY, July 1 (AP)—Inspection of the local airport and a flight to Wichita, Kan., was planned today by Col. Charles A. Lindbergh. The colonel accompanied by his bride arrived here late yesterday from St. Louis.

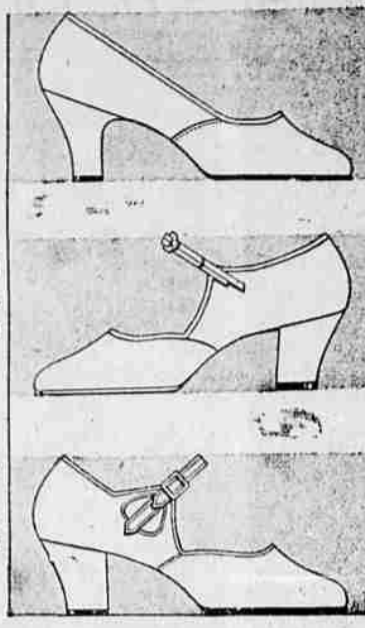
