Neither Yanks Nor Cardinals Expected to Win

By HERBERT W. BARKER (Associated Press Sports Writer) The Fourth July, time-honored point for fading pennant soundings, is close at hand and if baseball tradition holds true neither the New York Yankees nor the St. Louis Cardinals will repeat their major league championship victories of last year.

Baseball tradition has it that the leaders on July 4 are the pennant winners of late September. There have been exceptions to this rule but they have been surprisingly few and far between. As the races now stand, neither the Yankees nor the Cardinals can reach the top of their respective leagues by July 4. The Yankees languish in third place in the American league, nine full games back of the league-leading Philadelphia Athletics. The Cardinals trail the Chicago Cubs, pace-setters of the National circuit, by five games.

He crashed out two home runs and a double and drove in seven runs.

Yanks Win In the American League, the Yankees barely escaped dropping back a little further in the race. Benny Paschal's pinch home run

with Koenig on base in the seventh gave the champions a 2 to 2 verdict over the Boston Red Sox. Paschal's homer enabled the Yanks to share the split that Billy Rayne had won over them this season. Rayne already had beaten the champions twice and seemed to be well on the way to a third victory when Paschal came through. Herb Pennock was given credit for the victory although he was out of the game when the winning runs were scored. Paschal being a pinch batsman for him.

WIMBLEDON, England, July 2 (AP)—Bill Tilden and Frank Hunter, American tennis veterans, resumed their campaign for the British doubles championship today by defeating Hans Von Kehr, King of Hungary, and Heinrich Kleinbrodt of Germany, 6-4, 6-1.

Miss Helen Wills and Miss Ethel Cross, all-California entry in the women's doubles, were not so successful, losing to Mrs. C. G. McEneaney and Miss Krynitzky of Harvey, England. The scores were 6-1, 3-10, 6-1.

Jack Westland New Golf King Of All France

CHANTILLY, France, July 2 (AP)—Jack Westland, an American, won the French amateur golf championship today by defeating Richard Fletcher, an Englishman, in the final by a margin of six up and five to play.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 2 (AP)—With the San Francisco Mission Reds champions of the first half of the 1929 season as a result of the inaugural of the split season by directors of the Pacific Coast league here yesterday, the eight clubs were scheduled to resume their series play today for second half business.

The directors voted a bonus of \$10,000 to be appropriated from the league's treasury, a major part of which will be offered for a championship playoff series, and the balance of which will be distributed among the next three high clubs.

Wade Kilbrey's Mission Reds finished the first fourteen weeks of the 28-week season four games ahead of the second-place San Francisco Seals.
