ST. HELENS, Ore., July 2 (AP)—J. S. Culbertson, St. Helens deputy marshal, waived preliminary examination on a charge of perjury yesterday and was held to the grand jury under \$100 bonds after Ellen Chapman brought charges of perjury.

The complaint alleges Culbertson made a false affidavit when he swore he could not locate Percy Mathews, a material witness for him, in the case pending against him by Mrs. Chapman who is suing for \$25,000 damages for alleged assault and false imprisonment. The case was continued.

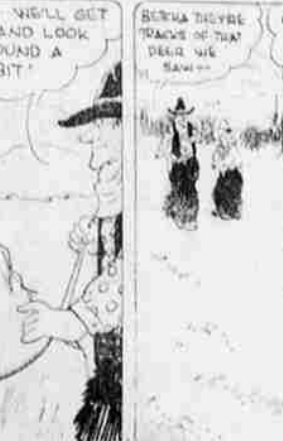
