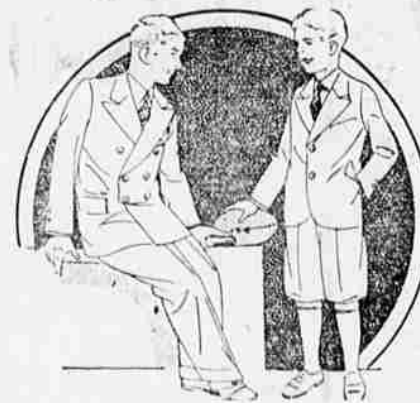

of 15 gallons, providing the 150 gallons they deemed necessary for the flight to Rome. It was believed they would have no difficulty in being above the horizon.

Williams was first in the cabin, Lewis stopping to check the weather. Then from the cabin both moved at the airplane controls and started the plane down in

short field. It rose in 20 seconds, dipped once in nature, and disappeared to the east.

The air ministry ordered all air-planes along the west coast to keep a sharp lookout for the aviators, with 20 military planes taking the air along the proposed route as soon as announcement was made of the departure from Santander.

SANTANDER, Spain, July 10 (AP)—Until we were very near the

above we were not able to see the sea.

During the night I took the controls from Williams, who had been slightly ill and went to sleep.

At about two or three o'clock Tuesday morning, when we were about 250 miles from the Azores the fog cleared somewhat and I saw a ship beneath us.

I was unable to distinguish its nationality but I dropped down almost vertically until I was just over its prow, letting its crew know by my maneuvers that I wanted them to broadcast our position for those who could be waiting to hear

from us.

The first descent awoke Williams, who told me not to do that any more since it might cost us dear.

We experienced two storms of little importance during the trip, one of these at 6 a. m. Tuesday, and the other at 5 a. m. Both drove us somewhat off our course, and upon the occasion of the latter we escaped its full force by climbing to an altitude which at times was 12,000 feet.

This extreme height continued until we passed Porto and Cape Orreaga, when the flow lower the

field of vision becoming much clearer.
