MENUS

For summer meals there seems to be no drink more refreshing than iced tea. It cools and quenches thirst as well as "cheers" in proverbial tea fashion if it's rightly made.

Children should not be allowed to drink the iced beverage any more than they would the hot one. The stimulating properties are there regardless of the temperature. Lemonade may be served with little trouble to small persons at the table when iced tea is provided for adults.

A certain technique must be developed if iced tea is at its best. Care in choosing the "brand," in brewing the tea and in serving must always be observed.

"Blended" Tea Best.
What is known as a "blended" tea is considered the best. The particular brand or trade name must be chosen individually. In making tea to be iced twice as much dry-leaf tea must be used as for hot tea. Otherwise the same rules apply. The hot freshly scalded tea, actively boiling water and steeping are the same for iced tea as for hot.


