waking up on a particularly hot day, the experience of walking up on a particularly hot morning to find the cream soup for the breakfast coffee.

In and of itself this is at best inopportune and at worst a tragedy, but after the immediate need for sweet cream will make some sort of a special delicacy.

Very little other shortening is usually required in cakes made with sour cream. The texture of the cake is fine, the crumb is moist and stays so while the taste is delicious. Soda is used as with sour milk.

Sour cream salad dressing has a taste all its own and is particularly good with fruit salads.

Sour cream frosting is one of the most satisfactory. It never gets dry and sugary and has a delightful and intriguing taste. Solid cream without a trace of milk must be used for the frosting.

Johnny cake is most acceptable with a cold luncheon of salad and cold meat, the Johnny cake being the only hot dish. Less cornmeal is used in "summer" Johnny cake than in the winter variety, for cornmeal is a heat producer and not generally used during hot weather.

**Johnny Cake**  
One cup sour cream, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-3 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1 cup white flour, 1-2 cup cornmeal.  
Beat egg well. Add salt, sugar and flour and mix until perfectly smooth. Add cream and cornmeal. Dissolve soda in a little boiling water and stir into the batter the last thing before baking. Pour into an oiled and floured dripping pan and bake 20 minutes in a moderate oven.
