

Amateur Vaulter Closes With Fine Michigan Record

When Harold McAtee leaped 13 feet, 4 3/4 inches at the national A.A.U. meet in Denver recently for a new junior pole vault mark, he closed his track career with the best effort he has made. Just to prove that it was no fluke, the Michigan state star went into the senior championships the next day and vaulted 13 feet, 6 inches for a three-corner tie. Under A.A.U. rules, a run-off was necessary. Then McAtee could do no better than 12 feet, 2 inches, for fourth place. McAtee's entrance in the national meet produced no special enthusiasm on the part of his friends. From his college records it was believed 12 feet was just about his "ceiling."

Family of Rebel In Superior, Arizona

SUPERIOR, Ariz. (AP) — In this little mining camp the family of Jose Gonzalez Escobar, insurrectionist military leader of Mexico recently, has found sanctuary with Mrs. Escobar's brother. Senora Ernestina Escalante de Escobar and sons, Armando, 29, and Jose, Jr., 17, are living quietly in the Mexican quarter in the residence of Antonio Escalante. The senora fled from Mexico in March, carrying \$100,000 across the border for her husband. Apparently unworried as to the general's safety, the family believes he is at present in Vancouver, B. C. Jose, Jr. last talked to his father in Nogales, Sonora, where the rebel refused to cross the line into the United States and safety. The family has been advised that the general took a boat at Guaymas, Sonora, after the revolt's collapse and fled to Canada. Armando and Jose, Jr. are students in an El Paso, Tex., school and are vacationing here with their mother.

Lake Cities Receive Large Ore Imports

CLEVELAND (AP)—More than 52,000,000 tons of iron ore flowed into the ports of the Great Lakes for the blast furnaces of Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois last year. The annual report of the Lake Superior Iron Ore association shows that the bulk of the flow went into nine cities on Lake Erie, Cleveland receiving 2,400,000 tons, Conneaut, Ohio, 8,400,000 and Ashtabula, Ohio, 6,400,000. Lorain took 3,400,000 tons, Fairport, 1,800,000, Toledo 1,500,000 and Huron 1,000,000. Buffalo's share was 4,200,000 tons, Erie's 700,000, and in Indiana South Chicago was the largest importer, with 7,000,000 tons. Gary received 4,800,000 and Detroit 1,000,000. The Mesaba-iron in Minnesota largest ore range, shipped 44,000,000 tons.

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BURLEIGH GRIMES WAS FAILURE IN EARLY BUC DAYS

NEW YORK (AP)—The strange case of Burleigh Grimes, now pitching the greatest ball of his long career for the Pittsburgh Pirates, after being traded by the Robins and Giants for unexplained reasons, may be traced back to his youth as a major leaguer. Burleigh, after a period of wandering in the south, broke into the big show with the Pirates late in 1915, remaining with the Bucs in 1917 before being traded to Brooklyn. In less than two seasons with the Pirates, Grimes won five and lost 19 games.

It has taken a long time for Burleigh to begin "getting out of the red," so far as his record as a Pirate goes, but once started he has made a rapid job of it.

In a season and a half, he now has won more than 40 games as against only some 15 defeats.
