agree to admit that the status of the railway has been changed as a result of its seizure and subject to further change in accordance with the Peking and Mukden agreements of 1924.

Same as Other Proposals With slight differences involving mutual recognition by the U. S. S. R. and China of the post-conflict status of the Chinese Eastern railway, M. Karakhan's formula for peaceful settlement of the controversy was the same as that offered by Tsai in proposals made to Melnikov July 25.

Whereas Tsai said that the Soviet government might declare it did not recognize any existing post-conflict status of the railroad M. Karakhan insisted that "the negotiating sides acknowledge a post-conflict status on the Chinese Eastern railway in accordance with the Peking-Mukden agreement of 1924."

Chang Hsueh Liang answered with a note, remaining silent on this point, which proved unacceptable to M. Karakhan. It provided that:

(1) The Chinese and Soviet governments appoint representatives to call a conference on the Chinese Eastern railway.

(2) The existing status of the railway be acknowledged as temporary, subject to regulations by a conference on the basis of the Peking-Mukden agreement.

(3) Arrested Soviet citizens to be freed but deported to Russia.

(4) Arrested Chinese citizens in Russia also to be freed.

Moscow viewed the Manchurian attitude as dictated by "imperialists."

of the Soviet radicals control by the working classes and a changed order of the world to provide for world-governing Soviet. Dr. Lewis went on to describe the methods used to instill these principles in China.

"They reach young students in the schools, particularly those with personal grudges or dissatisfaction with some Chinese conditions and instill in them their propaganda, so that they have built a very large following," related the missionary visitor.

"China now wants to rid herself of this method of creating radical elements and she has taken this step to do it."

It is in the lower classes, she added, that the soviet spirit mainly exists.

China's Future Bright Asked what she saw in the future for China, she prophesied, "I believe that within a few years China will enter her place with the powers of the white race on a dignified intelligent basis."

She has in the last few years been president of the school, but will return as advisor to the president, Miss Lucy Wang.

Lemons, Melons Quoted Higher; Butter Declines

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 2 (AP) —Because of surplus supplies, prime firsts and firsts in butter declined half a cent, the former to 42 and the latter to 41. Other grades were unaltered.

The egg market showed no change. The lemon price continued its flight today. Another advance of \$1 was added to a similar advance of Thursday. The fruit is now wholesaling at \$12 a case. A further advance would not be surprising in view of the demand in the east.

Peaches were more plentiful with a slight recession in values. A fine consignment of Crawford's was received today, ranging in price from \$1 to \$1.25.

Watermelons and cantaloupes were firm, with the watermelon price particularly stiff. No cucumber was expected until about August 19, when northwest melons begin to arrive.

Abundant supplies at the East Side market failed to affect prices.

Wheat Three To Four Cents Down At Chicago Close

CHICAGO, Aug. 2 (AP) —Wheat and corn prices turned sharply downward early today, influenced by lower Liverpool wheat quotations and by rain and cooler weather in the corn belt. Private crop estimates on wheat crop production were about as expected, and were devoid of important market effect.

Opening 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 lower, Chicago wheat later showed some further setback. Corn advanced 1/2 to 3/4 off, and subsequently held near to the initial range. Cattle and calves, provisions also declined.

After an extreme fall of 5 1/2 a bushel, wheat rallied somewhat and closed nervous, 2 1/2 to 4c under yesterday's finish. Corn closed 2 to 4c down, oats 1 to 3/4 off, and provisions unchanged to a setback of 12 to 30 lbs.
