Rebuilt Plane Crashes; Pilot, Two Others Die

CAMBELLSVILLE, Ky., Aug. 7. (AP)—A rebuilt plane piloted by a youthful unlicensed student pilot and powered with a motor of a type declared obsolete fell into an alley in the center of the town late yesterday, and the pilot and his two passengers met death as the wreckage was consumed by flames.

Hundreds of persons saw the plane go into a spin at an altitude of about 500 feet and careen to the earth, but were helpless to rescue the three from the flames. The pilot was Francis Mitchell, 25, of Louisville, and his passengers Carl E. Carter, 23, drug store owner, and Floyd Courts, 25, a clerk in the store.

Mrs. Nell and Irwin Voight, Jeffersonville, Ind., owner of the plane, had flown it here the day before and had been taking up passengers on sight-seeing trips. Voight bought the plane from a previous owner in April. It has been smashed last fall at Glasgow, Ky., but had been repaired and had been flown many hours since then.

(Continued from Page 1) ously burned yesterday while fighting the Shriner's Lake fire on the Rainier national forest in Washington, the district forestry office reported here today. The man was rushed to a hospital, presumably at Tacoma.

The Shriner's Lake fire was reported to be giving firefighters considerable trouble. Its size was not revealed in communications reaching here but the sending of 49 men to combat it indicated it covered a large area. In the Chelan national forest in Washington conditions were said to be the same as yesterday. This fire was burning fiercely.

TOWN IN RUINS

BLISE, Aug. 7 (AP)—The town of Quartzburg was smoking ruins today and flames were roaring up the steep sides of mountains on either side of Boise Basin, while crews from the Gold Hill mine, the Boise Pacific lumber camps of the Idaho City country, and the Shoshone Idaho Timber Protective association fought desperately to control.

The fire started late yesterday and was first reported to the state land department this morning after a 12 hour battle to confine the flames had met with failure.

(Continued from Page 1) pumping fuel and lifting gas into the airship's storage bags, said the task would be completed 12 hours before the take-off. Refueling the Zeppelin was one of the last duties of Lieutenant Commander Wicks as a naval officer. He has resigned to become hangar and construction superintendent for the Goodyear Zeppelin Corporation at Akron, Ohio, where two dirigibles, larger than the Graf Zeppelin, are to be built for the navy.

Weather O. K. Forecasts indicated that weather conditions would permit the start as scheduled. Cloudy weather, with possible showers, were in prospect, but Lieutenant S. P. Reichel, Lakehurst forecaster, said there would be no high wind to prevent the takeoff. Hans Von Schiller, one of the pilots of the Graf, said he expected the airship would reach Friedrichshafen early Sunday. Stopping there for three or four days the ship will set out for Tokyo and Los Angeles. Each trip is expected to take four or five days with lay overs of the same duration at each stop. The trip eastward across the United States is estimated to consume two or three days, which will bring the airship to her starting place here about September 2.

Weather reports will be supplied to the airship by radio as frequently as they are available. The jump from Friedrichshafen to Tokyo is regarded as the most hazardous, because mountains, clouds and rain may make navigation difficult and weather reports in that part of the world are meagre.

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 7 (AP)—Tomato prices took a big tumble at the east side market of the Gardeners and Ranchers' association today. The first grade were offered at 75 cents a crate and the second grade at 50 cents. Supplies were becoming more plentiful every day.

WHEAT GAINS FOUR CENTS IN PRICES TODAY

CHICAGO, Aug. 7 (AP)—With decided falling off in the movement of domestic winter wheat to primary terminals and with a better export demand wheat prices rallied briskly today. Primary receipts for three days this week were reported as 2,000,000 bushels more than for the corresponding time last week. Late estimates of wheat purchases today for shipment to Europe were 3,000,000 bushels or more, chiefly wheat from the United States, and there were liberal sales of wheat here to be taken to Buffalo.

MARKET HEAVY AT CLOSE IN WALL STREET

NEW YORK, Aug. 7 (AP)—The stock market rallied briskly under the leadership of the steel today, when all money dropped from a renewal rate of 10 to 8 per cent. The upturn, however, was not until after further liquidation of the utilities. The market turned dull on the decline, but activity picked up rapidly when the 30,000,000 share issue of the steel was announced.

Gang Fighting In Pittsburgh Kills Two Men

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 7. (AP)—Two men were slain here last night one at the door of a hospital and the other on the street in the east end district. The police described the slayings as "mob killings" believing they may have resulted from a continuation of gang fighting.

One of the victims was Steve Monastero, alleged racketeer, and the other was Tony Lito, Monastero was entering a north side hospital with his brother, Sam, to visit a friend. Shotguns were shoved through the curtains of an automobile parked near by and fired. Monastero fell and one of his assailants jumped from the ambush machine and fired several shots into the fallen man's head.

Rumania Strike Situation Calmer

RICHARDEST, Rumania, Aug. 7. (AP)—Clashes between troops and striking miners in the Lupeny district which have resulted in heavy loss of life, quieted down this morning while fresh military reinforcements took control of the situation. Officially the dead are numbered at 32 with 80 others seriously wounded, but it is generally believed that the number of dead will be larger, present estimates being as high as 58.

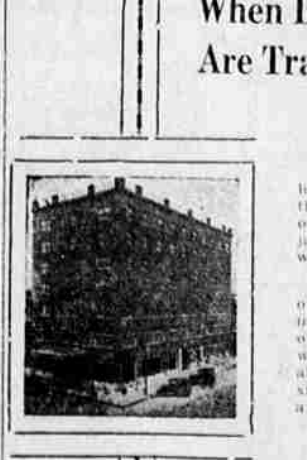
