### Mummy Excavated In Historic City

MEMPHIS, Aug. 8 (AP)—In the old historic Roman city of Aqueductum, now known as Tabor Hill, half-an-hour distant from Memphis, a mummy has been excavated which is believed to date from the second century A. D.

The tomb is filled with elaborate stone slabs illustrating episodes of animal life which are believed to have formed the ceiling of the sarcophagus. The mummy, believed to be that of the wife of a rich merchant, suffered considerable damage after it was exposed to daylight. The embalming was done with resin and it is perfect, but experts attribute it to an Egyptian who had been transported from Alexandria for this purpose.
