1000 PLANES TO COMPETE IN MEET Air Derby in Cleveland to Climax Year of Progress in Aviation.

By Allen Quinn (Associated Press Aviation Editor) CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP)—Capping a year of unprecedented progress in aviation, the national air races here August 24 to September 2, will bring together probably the greatest assembly of aircraft and pilots in aviation history.

Cleveland is spending \$150,000 enlarging and grading its airport, and in constructing air taxi buildings and a quarter-mile long grandstand seating 10,000. Roads to the airport are being widened and taxiways will be directed by national guardmen.

On the lake front an emergency landing field has been prepared, and a portion of the lake inside its breakwater has been set aside for the landing of seaplanes, flying boats and amphibians.

The aeronautical exposition in the municipal auditorium, will be the largest yet held in the United States. More than 100 manufacturers of airplanes and accessories, transport operators and flying schools have taken the 100,000 feet of floor space.

Nine air derbies are being contested, and 25 closed course events will make the 10 days of events alive with interest for spectator and aviator alike.

For the first time women will have a place on a national air race program. A cross-country race from Santa Monica, Cal., and four closed course races have been set aside for them.

Both men and women may enter a contest to break the world's solo endurance flight record. The sum of \$1,000 is offered the winner of a contest to break the world's non-stop distance record and another \$1,000 to the man who can break the 41-hour endurance record of the R. Louis Hobbs.

Daily prizes of \$100 and a grand prize of \$1,000 are offered to the winners in contests for landing in the mark.

Hoover Observes 55th Birthday In Quiet Of Woods MADISON, Va., Aug. 10 (AP)—Amid the quiet of the Blue Ridge mountains, broken only by the gurgle of trout stream and occasional call of a bird, President Hoover today celebrated his 55th birthday. He was surrounded by members of his family and a small group of friends and government officials.

The chief executive and members of his party breakfasted about eight o'clock. Afterwards, for some time, he sat with Secretary Hyde of the agricultural department and Dr. Hugh H. Cummings, chief of the public health service, on the front porch of the little town and reading copies of this morning's newspapers which had been brought by airplane.

Customs officials stood at the landing steps, waited all formalities, and by 1:25 p. m. the last few passengers, Lady Grace Drummond Hay and Karl H. von Weizsacker, had emerged.

All the passengers seemed to be a decidedly happy frame of mind and declared with one accord they had a wonderful time.

When Lady Hay stepped down she was smiling and holding a bouquet of flowers from American friends. The crowd which up to then had been mostly happy and curious broke into cheers.
