Several Price Changes Today In Oregon Mart

PORTLAND, Aug. 12 (AP)—Several products advanced while a number of others declined today at the East Side market of the Gardeners' and Haulers' association.

Loganberries went down to \$1.25. Corn dropped to \$1.25 for a bushel of six dozen ears.

Green peppers were lower at 60 cents a bushel.

Eggplant slumped to 60.

Asparagus beans were 3 cents a pound.

New potatoes went up to 24 cents a pound.

Asparagus, real scarce, sold for \$1.25 for 2 1/2 dozen bunches.

French beans advanced to 7 cents.

Tomatoes were higher at 75 cents.

No apricots were brought in.

Peaches went for \$1 to \$1.10.

RESUME TRADE IN BUTTER IN PORTLAND, ORE.

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 12 (AP)—Trading in butter, which was suspended several weeks ago when the Portland Dairy Exchange ceased operations because of internal controversy, was resumed today under auspices of the newly organized Portland Produce Exchange.

Ray Brandes of Portland was elected president; H. W. Kaupisch, Corvallis, vice president, and H. Birkshaw, Portland, secretary.

Sessions will be held in the Merchant's Exchange building on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week.

This leaves the egg trade still without an official trading medium.
