

REID, BONTE HOPE TO MAKE NEW AIR MARK

LONG BEACH, Cal., Aug. 15 (AP)—With the record for non-refueling endurance flight 45 hours 25 minutes before them as a goal, Jack Reid and Emory Bonte continued to circle the Municipal airport here today after their takeoff at 6:04 a. m. yesterday, in an effort to outlast the German mark by more than an hour.

At 1:04 a. m., the pair had kept their 200-horsepower, cabin model monoplane in the air 19 hours with the plane functioning nicely and the weather conditions excellent. They expected no difficulty in shattering the record. To do so they must stay in the air until 12:25 a. m. Saturday. The fliers took 850 gallons of gasoline and 30 gallons of oil with them on the flight.

A previous attempt failed shortly after the takeoff when the motor became overheated.
