

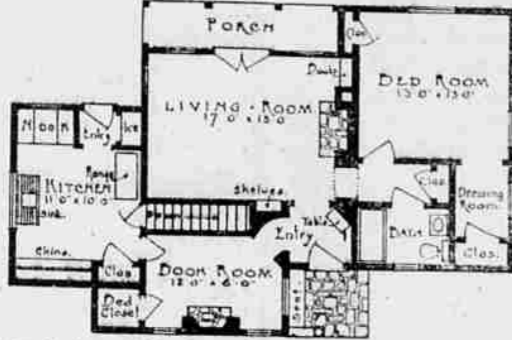

Note the novel manner employed to find space for the console table in the entry and entrance to the living room. With its low ceiling, plastered walls and grade plastering cannot but help recall the entrance to be found in the British Isles which were built during the middle ages.

The book room boasts of a fireplace as this room in reality becomes a living-room for the purpose. The "chair" in this room is large enough to contain a folding cot, so that it may serve as a guest bedroom. One bedroom is provided on the second floor.

The porch floors and fireplace hearth are of stone flagging. The floors in the principal rooms are of dark stained oak, plastering is straw colored, and woodwork is stained. The ceilings are low and all windows have steel casement type opening out. The exterior



walls are of stucco finished to represent a stone wall roughly plastered. The stone quoins being left exposed around the main entrance door repeating the stone work of the garden walls.

The wood shingle roof appears as if some of the rough timbers had failed to support their load and deliberate sag appears in the surface, its color ranging from a

light straw to a very deep brown. The foundation is concrete and the basement floor is cement. The usual hot air furnace, laundry trays, etc., are located in the basement.

This house is 45 ft. wide, and would require a sixty foot lot. It is estimated that this house would cost between \$8,000 and \$10,000, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

This Includes an Unofficial \$150,000 for New Normal School.

Building permits in La Grande for this year, including unofficially an estimate of \$150,000 for the new Eastern Oregon Normal school, approximated \$235,265 at the conclusion of last week. The figures for the permits actually issued total \$83,265 and adding to this an estimate for the normal school gives the total figure.

Only one permit was issued here last week, that to H. P. Nielsen to alter and repair a street business building on Depot between Depot and Fifth for Mr. McWilliams, work to cost about \$50.

Permits issued so far this month call for new construction in the amount of \$1,950.

THE GARDEN

Plant spring flowering bulbs as early in September as you can buy them. While these bulbs can be put in as late as December, and some of them up to January with some satisfaction, much better results come from earlier planting.

Pollus, daffodils and hyacinths are what we refer to mostly as spring flowering bulbs. They should be ordered from the seedsmen right away, and should be unpacked and planted as soon as delivered.

All of these bulbs are adapted to bedding and border decoration. The bulbs are set about 4 inches deep if the beds are to be taken up annually, but deeper planting is advisable if they are to remain a number of years.

Daffodils under nearly all circumstances can be left in permanent, but pollen and hyacinths are much better if lifted annually. The distances apart in the beds will depend on the size of the bulbs, not be than 4 inches, nor more than 6 inches, each way, is necessary.

One of the greatest difficulties encountered by the inexperienced grower is the selection of varieties. The lists are so long, and the varieties so numerous, the task of selection is difficult. These features are impressive, however.

The number of varieties is being reduced by growers and dealers in nearly all groups, and the lists of bulbs do not generally contain poor varieties. There is usually a short description which, at least designates the color. The gardener can therefore easily obtain the color he desires. The actual variety often does not matter so much, for they are a dozen reds in tulips that will have good satisfaction, or a score of yellow trumpet daffodils that will do well and satisfy all but the very critical.

The discriminating grower must know the varieties, but he who would have a show in his garden need not worry so much about this feature, so long as he has the color he wants.
