The housekeeper who has an efficient and sufficient emergency shelf in her cupboard need have no anxious moments when guests drop in unexpectedly.

A jar of salad dressing, a bottle of mixed stuffed and plain olives, several varieties of tinned fish, a box of sweet crackers, a box of salty crackers of some sort, several cans of extra fine preserves, bouillon cubes and canned soups make it possible to serve an attractive luncheon at a moment's notice.

Refrigerator Helps, Too

The refrigerator makes it possible to keep several varieties of cheese which is marketed in packages as well as cold baked ham or boiled tongue and lettuce.

A cup of bouillon, a salad, bread and butter with preserves and tea or milk furnish a luncheon of which no woman need be ashamed.

The one precaution regarding an emergency shelf is that of replenishing. Whenever a staple is used, be sure to replace it at once and do not use the shelf for every day, family convenience. If there is danger of the materials losing their freshness, use them for company as needed and replace with fresh stock.
