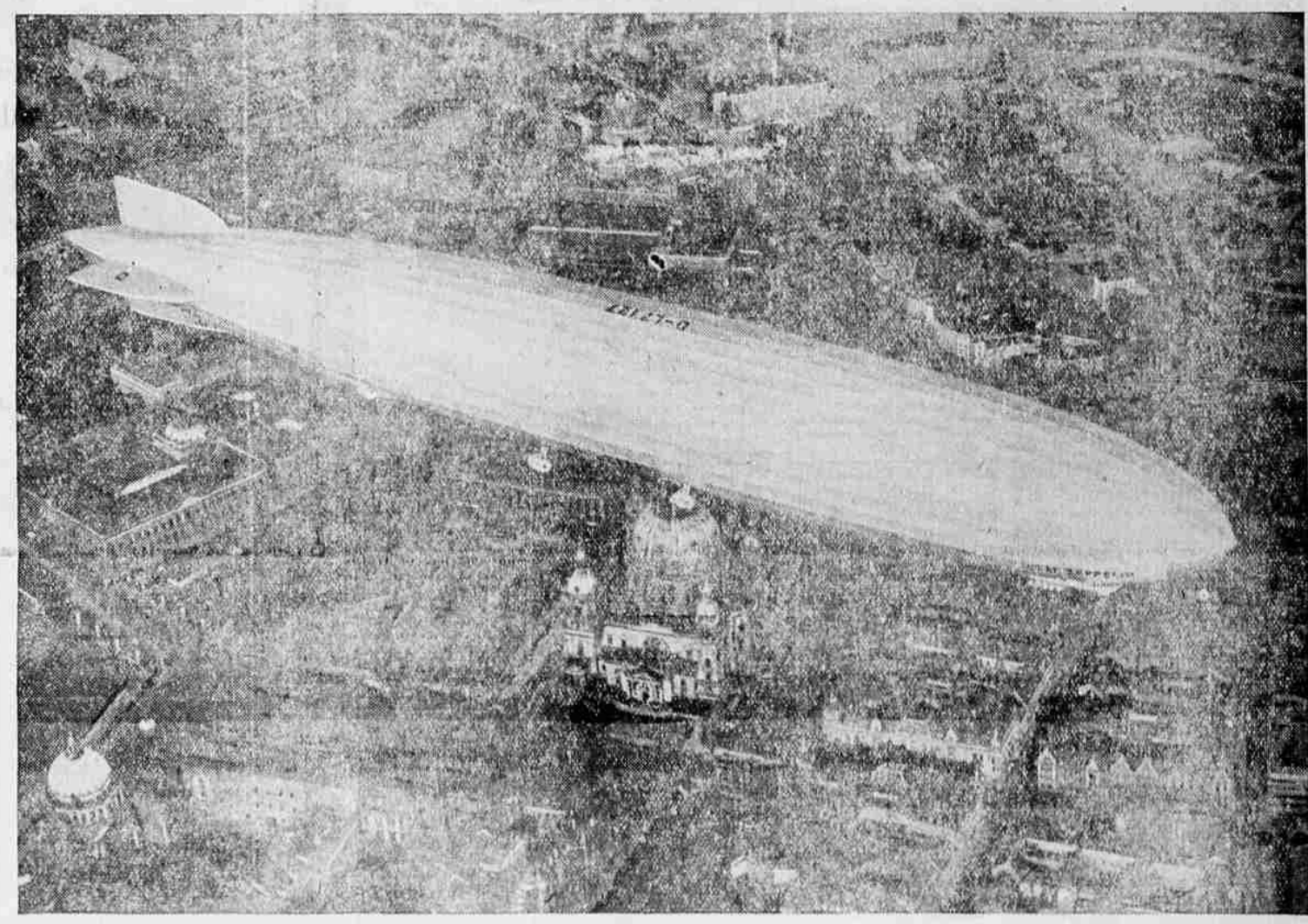
**John Whitney in Salem**—A former druggist of La Grande, John Whitney, is now in the drug-store business in Salem, Ore.
