## Wheat Regains Nearly 3 Cents In Market Today

CHICAGO, Aug. 29 (AP)—Bullish cables from the Argentine and short covering in an overbought market reversed an early downturn on the Chicago wheat market today. Exporting was still quiet and dullness at Liverpool weakened Chicago at first but a rally of four cents from the bottom ousted with shorts buying all the way up. Profit taking trimmed down the net gain. Other grains firmed up on adverse crop news and corn for December delivery crossed the dollar mark.

## Rail Shares Lead In Bullish Trend

NEW YORK, Aug. 29 (AP)—The railroad shares again furnished impressive leadership in today's stock market, with a dozen issues rising 1 to 10 points to new high records. Among the general list was a rather selective character, with the food, public utility and chemical shares, showing several points of strength while the metal, hardware, and copper made little headway.
