crisis arising out of Manchurian seizure of the Chinese Eastern railway.

Maxim Litvinoff, vice minister for foreign affairs, in a note to Dr. Herbert von Dirksen, German ambassador, announced the U. S. S. R. was willing to sign with the Nanking government a joint declaration for settlement of all questions arising out of the dispute.

The Soviet acceptance of the Chinese proposal was announced at a time when agitation for punitive measures in China was reaching a peak as the result of advances of the execution of four Soviet citizens by the Chinese government. Soviet officials hailed the move of the Foreign commission as indicating a real desire for peace and firm adherence to the Kellogg anti-war pact.
