California Checks On Adequate Brakes

The Oregon law demands adequate brakes but the law is subject to varied interpretation and is difficult to enforce because of its indefinite standards, according to the Oregon State Motor Association.

The new California law which went into effect August 14th offers a definite standard of stopping distances at various speeds on a dry asphalt or concrete pavement and consequently makes it very easy to ascertain whether a car has legal brakes or not.

The California law specifies that a car shall have sufficient brakes to bring it to a stop at the following speeds and distances:

Miles per hr.	Stopping distance
10	6.5 feet
15	20.8 feet
20	27.0 feet
25	38.0 feet
30	52.2 feet

Gasoline Sales In Oregon Reach New High Level

RALEIGH, Ore., Aug. 31, (Special)—Newspapering the steady gain in gasoline sales which has been apparent each succeeding month during the current year, an all-time record is being set for the month of June, according to the figures collected by the secretary of state. The sales of gasoline alone for this month reached 15,257,373 gallons. This is an increase of 1,643,224 gallons over the same month in 1928, and 2,127,716 gallons over the sales of June, 1927. The receipts for June covering gasoline and distillate sales total \$460,190,550 under the two laws in effect this year, bringing the accumulated total to June 30th of the current year to \$2,089,478,841. The tax to June 30th of 1928 amounted to \$1,827,730,450 and the total tax for the entire year, as of June 30th, 1929, was \$4,008,417,977. With the substantial gain already collected, there is a possibility that the receipts by December 31st will be far beyond those of any previous year.

From February 26, 1929, when the first gasoline tax law became effective, to June 30th of the present year, more than \$24,000,000,000 has been collected in gasoline tax.
