A Seasonable Recipe.—Three medium sized cucumbers, sliced cucumber and onions to taste and cook in salt water for four hours. Take out and rinse well in fresh water. Have the following ingredients mixed together and bottled:

- One pint vinegar
- One teaspoon sugar
- One-half teaspoon mustard seed
- One-half teaspoon curry powder
- One-half teaspoon cayenne
- One-half teaspoon black pepper
- One-half teaspoon celery seed
- Small pinch of red pepper

To this mixture add the cucumbers and onions. Boil for a half hour or until tender. Put up in jars when cool. After two days the mix is ready to use.
