Urge Drivers To
Avoid Animal Life

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 14.—There seems to be a difference of opinion regarding whether animals think but it is beyond question that motorists do and for this reason, the American Automobile association officials declare, the nationwide motor organization has undertaken to enlist every driver in a national campaign to reduce highway casualties among animals, domestic fowl and birds, states a recent report of the American Automobile association.

"Thousands of animals and birds are victims of the automobile annually. Many of these fatalities are unavoidable but undoubtedly the number can be greatly reduced if every motorist will take it upon himself to exercise slightly more than reasonable care when his path is obstructed by a dog, cat, rabbit, squirrel or chicken.

"In making its appeal the A. A. A. counts confidently upon the good sportsmanship of the American motor car owner," officials say.

SURGEON FORCED DOWN

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Sept. 13 (AP)—Dr. Glen Moore, Sr., surgeon, and his brother, Leo Moore, were forced to land at Grants Pass near here last night after having turned their north-bound plane back twice on account of heavy smoke caused by the forest fire.

FRUIT RATE EXTENDED

MEDFORD, Ore., Sept. 13 (AP)—The emergency fruit rate of \$1.60 per hundred has been extended to June 1, 1930, by the Transcontinental Freight bureau upon application of the Southern Pacific. The rate was to have expired Jan. 31, next. The extension permits cheaper shipment of winter variety of pears, held in storage, for late delivery in eastern markets. These shipments are expected to amount to 1500 cars.

Studebaker Eight
Wins Peak Contest

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., (Special)—The 11th national Pike Peak hill climbing classic on Labor day was won by a fully equipped officially certified stock Studebaker President eight roadster, which by its feat captured the historic Penrose trophy. All existing stock car records for the course were smashed.

The winning car, piloted by Glen Schultz, famous race driver, completed the 12.4 mile grind to the summit of America's most famous mountain 14,199 feet high in 21 minutes, 43 2-5 seconds, bettering the previous stock car record by a margin of two seconds. His average speed was 24.3 miles per hour.

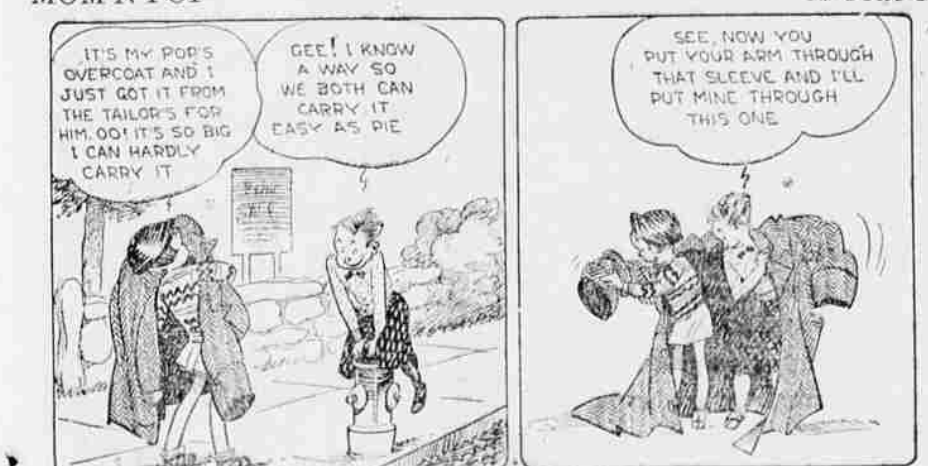
