Sunday Church Programs Will Include Solos

Beautiful Musical Selections Arranged for in Addition to Interesting Sermons.

The announcements for Sunday follow:

First M. E. Church
The subject for the morning hour of worship is "The Devotion of Man's Religion." The church choir under the leadership of Professor W. W. Nussbaum renders sacred music that never fails to inspire and delight.
