Union Co. Movie Is Being Shown At The Arcade

The first showing of three reels of Union county moving pictures, taken during the late summer by the Seaside Educational Film company in co-operation with S. L. Thompson, of the Union county development league, is being held at the Arcade theater this weekend and in its trailer, the film met with the popular approval of the audience.

The civic film touches up on the business, industrial and agricultural life of La Grande and the valley, as well as showing some well photographed pictures of Union, Walla Walla and Umatilla county scenery, including Walla Walla, Lehigh Springs, and the Grande Ronde valley. Scenes of wheat harvesting, lumbering, the manufacture of flour and many other interesting features of local activities make the picture of particular interest in this community.

Busy Adams avenue, the new normal school, the county court house and its staff of officials, the Lions club and its recent caravan over the proposed scenic highway, the Rotary club, pictures of beautiful local residences, exterior and interior views of local business places, the state highway shops, a heavily loaded logging train are other features of the civic film.
