Trojans Taking Game Seriously

Jones Drilling His Piskin Experts for Tilt With Oregon State.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 2 (AP)—Another stiff scrimmage was in line for the University of Southern California grid eleven today, evidence that to Coach Howard Jones, the Oregon State piskin experts who appear here next Saturday, are so threatening in appearance, to be taken anyway but seriously.

Using the military shift, which Coach Paul Schuster of the Invaders imported from New York University last fall, and revised, the spartans gave Jones' Trojan variety a lesson or two in the way of some snappy offense formations.
