Lindbergh Finds Unknown Ruins In British Honduras

Discovery of Evidence of Maya Habitations Excites Scientists in Flier's Party.

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 8 (AP)—Discovery of Maya ruins, believed never before seen by white men, was reported by the radio operator aboard Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh's plane flying in the vicinity of Lake Yaxha, British Honduras...

After reporting the take-off from Belize on the third trip on the joint Carnegie Institution-Pan American Airways scientific expedition and a landing and take-off at Lake Yaxha, radio operator William Ehmer broke his route message with: "Flash—We have discovered regular ruins now, circling them. Scientists all het up." Ehmer promised details later.

LANDS IN JUNGLE

BELIZE, British Honduras, Oct. 8 (AP)—Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, seeking ancient Maya ruins, yesterday brought his giant plane down with rare skill in the midst of the Yucatan jungle on a small field green watered pool.

He and his birds entered a rubber boat and, chopping their way through reeds and underbrush with machetes made their way to shore, where they looked for ruins and relics of the lost Maya civilization.

Alligators, with which the lake was infested, kept a respectful distance, apparently much frightened by the noise and activity which had dropped down on its lair.

While they were ashore, Mrs. Lindbergh served her husband, the two scientists who were with them, and the plane's radio operator, with a typical field lunch consisting of raisins, bananas and crackers.

The landing, which was near the banks of Lake de Chichen Anaba, Quintana Roo, was fruitless, the party finding neither ruins nor human habitation, nor signs of life other than the wild life usual in the Yucatan jungle.

The jungle stop was made at noon, while the party was en route from Merida, Yucatan, across the peninsula to Belize, over a course of about 400 miles.

During the latter part of the flight Dr. Oliver Dickson, also of the Carnegie Institute, took Mrs. Lindbergh's place in the cockpit alongside her husband, and discussed with him charting of the indications they found. Mrs. Lindbergh, still wearing her khaki knickerbockers and blue shirt, assisted Dr. Kidder in the photographing.

The plane arrived at Belize shortly after 5 p. m. Its occupants, tired, happy, exultant at their experiences, but all red with sunburn, tomorrow they will fly into the Flores region, north and west of this city.

Vegetables And Fruit Worth Six Millions Tied Up

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—The metropolitan area was cut off from its supply of fresh vegetables and fruits today by a rail embargo while market truckmen and their employers strove to settle the strike which has clogged terminals with \$6,000,000 worth of perishable produce.

Threatened by a blockade in their freight yards where 2,000 cars of produce have accumulated since the strike was called Saturday night, the New York Central, Pennsylvania, Central railroad of New Jersey, Lehigh Valley, Delaware, Lackawanna and Western and the Erie railroad put the embargo into effect at midnight.

Agents throughout the country were instructed not to accept shipments of perishable produce consigned to New York until further notice. Shipments en route east of Chicago were ordered diverted to Boston, Philadelphia or back to Chicago. Produce in transit west of Chicago were retroactively to be returned to the shippers.

EHMEKE HOLDS CUB HITTERS TO LONE RUN

Foxx's Home Run Breaks Scoreless Tie Near End of Game.

CROWD OF 50,000 WITNESS CONTEST

Chicago Fails to Cross Home Plate Until Ninth, When Rally Fails to Win.

WRIGHT FIELD, Chicago, Oct. 8 (AP)—Howard Ehmeke, veteran right hander of the Athletics, justified his expected selection today for the opening game of the world's series by beating the Chicago Cubs, 3 to 1, and smacking all major league bats by striking out thirteen men before a crowd estimated at 50,000.

Foxx hit a homer to break a six-inning scoreless tie, and the Athletics scored two more in the ninth while the Cubs gathered in one run in a futile rally.

In weather more suited to football than baseball, with a cold breeze whirling through the park, the Cubs and Athletics battled today in the first game of the 1929 world's series. The home field of the National league champions was filled to its estimated capacity of 50,000 fans, bundled in furs and overcoats for the opening struggle between two of the most colorful clubs in baseball.

Teams put their full strength on the field from the first battle. Al Miller started for the A's in spite of a heavy cold.

WRIGHT FIELD, Chicago, Oct. 8 (AP)—The vast crowd stood with bared heads as the national anthem was played, the field cleared for action.

The umpire did not appear until the last minute, giving the photographers an opportunity to get a few last minute "shots." Root finished his warming up and retired to the bench, but Ehmeke continued to toss the ball up to Cochran, using a slow, easy delivery and mixing curves with slow balls. He threw fast balls. As game time was only one minute away, the umpire still had not put in an appearance. There were indications of impatience on the part of a portion of the crowd of 50,000 persons and a few cries "Where are the umpires?" went up.
